1.9	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 122A.14, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.11	Subd. 3a. English learner microcredential. The board must adopt rules establishing a
1.12	voluntary administrative microcredential for English learner and emerging multilingual
1.13	learner directors and coordinators.
1.14	Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 122A.187, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.15	Subd. 3. Professional growth. (a) Applicants for license renewal for a Tier 3 or Tier 4

1.18	must present to their local continuing education and relicensure committee or other local

3.25	(b) A school district's students with limited or interrupted formal education (SLIFE)
