1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. LEGISLATIVE STUDY GROUP ON RESTRUCTURING THE
1.6	DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Establishment. A 12-member legislative study group is established to
1.8	prepare a plan to restructure the Department of Human Services.
1.9	Subd. 2. Members. (a) The legislative study group on restructuring the Department of
1.10	Human Services includes:
1.11	(1) six duly elected and currently serving members of the house of representatives, three
1.12	appointed by the speaker of the house and three appointed by the house minority leader,
1.13	and one of whom must be the current chair of the house of representatives Human Services
1.14	Finance and Policy Committee;
1.15	(2) six duly elected and currently serving senators, three appointed by the senate majority
1.16	leader and three appointed by the senate minority leader, one of whom must be the current
1.17	chair of the senate Human Services Reform Finance and Policy Committee; and
1.18	(3) the legislative auditor or a designee as an ex officio member.
1.19	(b) The appointments must be made by July 1, 2022, and expire January 31, 2024.
1.20	(c) If a vacancy occurs, the leader of the caucus in the house of representatives or senate
1.21	to which the vacating study group member belonged must fill the vacancy.

3.13	or on the date upon which the report required under subdivision 8 is submitted to the
3.14	legislature, whichever is later.
