AN ACT

To repeal section 163.172, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to salaries of school employees.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 163.172, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as sections 163.172 and 168.800, to read as follows:

163.172. 1. In school year 1994-95 and thereafter until school year 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall be eighteen thousand dollars. Beginning in school year 2006-07, 2 3 the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-two thousand dollars; in school year 2007-08, the 4 minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-three thousand dollars; in school year 2008-09, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars; in school year 2009-10 and 5 thereafter, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-five thousand dollars. Beginning in the 6 school year 1996-97 until school year 2006-07, for any full-time teacher with a master's degree 7 and at least ten years' teaching experience in a public school or combination of public schools, 8 the minimum salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars. Beginning in the school year 9 10 2006-07, for any full-time teacher with a master's degree in an academic teaching field and at 11 least ten years' teaching experience in a public school or combination of public schools, the minimum salary shall be thirty thousand dollars; in the 2007-08 school year such minimum 12 salary shall be thirty-one thousand dollars; in the 2008-09 school year such minimum salary shall 13 14 be thirty-two thousand dollars; and in the 2009-10 school year such minimum salary shall be 15 thirty-three thousand dollars.

16 2. Beginning with the budget requests for fiscal year 1991, the commissioner of 17 education shall present to the appropriate committees of the general assembly information on the 18 average Missouri teacher's salary, regional average salary data, and national average salary data.

3. All school salary information shall be public information.

4. As used in this section, the term "salary" shall be defined as the salary figure which
appears on the teacher's contract and as determined by the local school district's basic salary
schedule and does not include supplements for extra duties.

5. The minimum salary for any fully certificated teacher employed on a less than full-time basis by a school district, state school for the severely handicapped, the Missouri School for the Deaf, or the Missouri School for the Blind shall be prorated to reflect the amounts provided in subsection 1 of this section.

6. If a teacher has earned thirty credit hours in graduate-level courses or undergraduate-level courses in a field closely related to subjects taught by the teacher and approved by the school board of the district that employs the teacher, the teacher shall be considered to have a master's degree in an academic teaching field for purposes of this

168.800. 1. If a school district uses a salary schedule in which a teacher receives a higher salary if he or she has earned a master's degree, the school district shall compensate 2 3 any teacher who has earned thirty credit hours in graduate-level or undergraduate-level 4 courses in a field closely related to subjects taught by the teacher and approved by the 5 school board of the district as if the teacher had earned the master's degree required to receive a higher salary on the salary schedule. If the district's salary schedule has different 6 levels of compensation based on the type of master's degree, the district shall compensate 7 the teacher as if the teacher had earned the master's degree with the lowest level of 8 compensation on the salary schedule. 9

10 2. If a district employee who holds a master's degree in educational administration 11 earns additional credit hours in graduate-level courses beyond the master's degree, the 12 school district shall not increase his or her compensation on the salary schedule due to the 13 additional credit hours unless he or she holds an administrative position. If the employee 14 does not hold an administrative position at the time he or she earns the additional credit 15 hours but later holds an administrative position, the employee's school district shall count 16 the additional credit hours in determining his or her salary in the administrative position 17 if its salary schedule allows for an increase based on those hours.

3. The department of elementary and secondary education shall ensure that its
 evaluations, data collections, and website are updated to reflect the requirements of this
 section.
