AN ACT

To amend chapter 160, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to public school safety assessments.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 160, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 160.661, to read as follows:

160.661. 1. The department of elementary and secondary education shall conduct a safety assessment of every public school and public charter school in the state pursuant to the provisions of this section. The department of public safety shall provide reasonable assistance to the department of elementary and secondary education in order to implement the provisions of this section. The department of elementary and secondary education may also seek assistance from the Missouri center for education safety.

8 2. The school safety assessments shall include, but shall not be limited to, a 9 consideration of each school building's vulnerabilities to school shootings and intruders, 10 and shall include an assessment of each school's implementation of the following safety 11 procedures, policies, and tools:

12 (1) Access controls, including the safety of school doors, locking devices, 13 intercom or buzzer systems, and vestibules;

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 - (2) Video surveillance equipment used to monitor school buildings and buses;

15 (3) Visitor management systems, including software that records the usage of 16 school facilities by visitors;

(5) Emergency communication tools, including safety alert messaging systems;

School safety procedures and policies, including safety planning,

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(7) Bleeding control kits, including tourniquets, bleeding control bandages,
latex-free protective gloves, permanent markers, and instructional documents
developed by the United States Department of Homeland Security's Stop the Bleed
national awareness campaign or the American College of Surgeons Committee on
Trauma, or both;

(8) Automatic external defibrillators used to help those experiencing sudden
cardiac arrest;

29 (9) Fencing to secure playgrounds;

30 (10) Bollards to protect front entrances; and

vulnerability assessments, and staff training;

(11) Safety film to prevent the shattering of glass in doors, windows, and32 sidelights.

33 **3.** Based upon the findings of the safety assessments, the department of 34 elementary and secondary education shall provide to each public school and charter 35 school a report summarizing each school's safety vulnerabilities in the areas outlined in 36 subsection 2 of this section, and shall provide specific recommendations for mitigating 37 any such safety vulnerabilities.

4. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to relieve any school district, public school, or public charter school from the responsibility to maintain school safety standards established in the Missouri school improvement program or otherwise required by state or federal law.

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
