AN ACT

To repeal section 115.349, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.349, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 115.349, to read as follows:

115.349. 1. Except as otherwise provided in sections 115.361 to 115.383 or sections
115.755 to 115.785, no candidate's name shall be printed on any official primary ballot unless

the candidate has filed a written declaration of candidacy in the office of the appropriate election official by 5:00 p.m. on the [last] second Tuesday in March immediately preceding the primary

2. No declaration of candidacy for nomination in a primary election shall be accepted for filing prior to 8:00 a.m. on the last Tuesday in February immediately preceding the primary election.

3. Each declaration of candidacy for nomination in a primary election shall state the candidate's full name, residence address, office for which such candidate proposes to be a candidate, the party ticket on which he or she wishes to be a candidate and that if nominated and elected he or she will qualify. The declaration shall be in substantially the following form:
