AN ACT

To repeal section 115.646, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the use of public funds for lobbying activities, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.646, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as sections 105.1435 and 115.646, to read as follows:

105.1435. 1. No employee of a state agency or department shall engage in any activity requiring registration as a legislative lobbyist, as such term is defined in section 2 104.470, testify in an official capacity in favor of or against legislation before a committee 3 4 of the general assembly, or remain on the floor of either chamber of the general assembly during a session thereof while receiving compensation for time worked including per-diem 5 compensation. This section shall not be construed to prohibit any state agency official or 6 employee from making public appearances or testifying before a committee of the general 7 8 assembly for informational purposes only. State agency employees may provide their own personal opinions on legislation at committee meetings of the general assembly or with 9 10 individual legislators during those hours when they are not being compensated for time 11 worked or receiving a per diem. Salaried employees shall not count any time spent 12 providing personal opinions on legislation as compensated time without regard to whether 13 the time is compensated at an hourly rate or is a salary requirement. 14 2. The restrictions on lobbying and the expenditure of public funds for lobbying 15 in this section shall not be interpreted to include any of the political activities of elected

16 statewide officials, members of the general assembly, members of the judicial branch of

17 government, or the staff and employees of such elected officials and judges.

115.646. 1. No contribution or expenditure of public funds shall be made directly by any officer, employee or agent of any political subdivision to advocate, support, or oppose any ballot measure, legislation, or candidate for public office. This section shall not be construed to prohibit any public official of a political subdivision from making public appearances or from issuing press releases concerning any such ballot measure.

6 2. No contribution or expenditure of public funds shall be made directly by any 7 state agency or any member or employee thereof to advocate, support, or oppose any ballot 8 measure or candidate for public office or to employ in any capacity whatsoever, whether full-time or part-time or under a contractual agreement, any individual who is required 9 10 to register as a legislative lobbyist as such term is defined in section 105.470. No state agency shall compensate or provide anything of value to an individual required to register 11 12 as a legislative lobbyist, as such term is defined in section 105.470, in exchange for such individual's lobbying services. A violation of this subsection shall be a class B 13 14 misdemeanor.

153. The restrictions on lobbying and the expenditure of public funds for lobbying16in this section shall not be interpreted to include any of the political activities of elected17statewide officials, members of the general assembly, members of the judicial branch of

18 government, or the staff and employees of such elected officials and judges.
