AN ACT

Relating to an application to Congress for approval of the secession of the City of St. Louis from the State of Missouri.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, The State of Missouri is functional to the extent that its people agree on politics, society, and economics; and

WHEREAS, the people who constitute the majority of the City of St. Louis and the people who constitute the remaining portion of the state hold different and firmly seated views on these important questions; and

WHEREAS, both groups should enjoy the chance to govern themselves with their firmly seated values; and

WHEREAS, Article IV, Section 3 of the Constitution of the United States provides that "New States may be admitted by the Congress into this Union; but no new States shall be formed or erected within the Jurisdiction of any other State; nor any State be formed by the Junction of two or more States, without the Consent of the Legislatures of the States concerned as well as of the Congress."; and

19 20 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby authorize a referendum to be held to confirm the desire of the voters of Missouri to separate the City of St. Louis and the rest of the Missouri into two separate states; and
