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2	WHEREAS, ensuring the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this state is one of the most important duties of the Missouri state government; and
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4	WHEREAS, gun violence is a national epidemic; and
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6 7	WHEREAS, Missouri has the seventh-highest gun-violence rate in the United States; and
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9 10 11	WHEREAS, other states have enacted various laws to address gun violence, and these different approaches provide an opportunity to examine which laws successfully reduce gun violence; and
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13 14	WHEREAS, it is crucial to determine whether Missouri's gun laws are working effectively and whether additional legislative action would be beneficial:
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16 17 18	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundred First General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby establish the "Joint Committee on Gun Violence and Legislation"; and
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the mission of the Joint Committee on Gun
21	Violence and Legislation is to:

(1) Review gun laws currently in effect in Missouri;

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23 24	(2) Consult with and hear testimony of gun-law experts and community members with experience relating to gun laws;
25	(3) Study and discuss gun laws in other states;
26 27	(4) Discuss and determine whether new gun laws would reduce gun violence in Missouri; and
28 29	(5) Develop recommendations for the General Assembly on possible legislative action regarding gun laws; and
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31 32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Committee on Gun Violence and Legislation shall consist of the following members:
33 34	(1) Four members of the majority party of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
35 36	(2) Four members of the minority party of the House of Representatives, appointed by the minority leader of the House of Representatives;
37 38	(3) Four members of the majority party of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro- Tempore of the Senate; and
39 40	(4) Four members of the minority party of the Senate, appointed by the minority leader of the Senate; and
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42 43 44 45	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the staffs of House Research, Senate Research and the Joint Committee on Legislative Research shall provide such legal, research, clerical technical, and bill drafting services as the Joint Committee on Gun Violence and Legislation may require in the performance of its duties; and
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47 48 49 50	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Committee on Gun Violence and Legislation, its members, and any staff assigned to the Joint Committee shall receive reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the Joint Committee or any subcommittee thereof; and

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52	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Committee shall meet within two months
53	of the adoption of this resolution; and
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55	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Committee shall report a summary of its
56	activities and any recommendations for legislation to the General Assembly before January 1,
57	2022; and
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59	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Committee is authorized to function
60	during the legislative interim of the first regular session of the One Hundred First General
61	Assembly, as authorized by State v. Atterbury, 300 S.W.2d 806 (Mo. 1957); and
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63	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Committee shall terminate on January
64	1, 2022; and
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66	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
67	Representatives be instructed to prepare properly inscribed copies of this resolution for the
68	Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
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
