	WHEREAS, motorcycle ridership has continued to increase over time, with		
2	registrations growing from 3,826,373 in 1997 to 8,600,936 in 2015; and

4	WHEREAS, as of August 2016 the ongoing National Motorcycle Profiling Survey		
5	2016, conducted by the Motorcycle Profiling Project, found that approximately one-half of		
6	the motorcyclists surveyed felt that they had been profiled by law enforcement at least once;		
7	and

9	WHEREAS, motorcycle profiling means the illegal use of the fact that a person rides		
10	a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related apparel as a factor in deciding to stop and question,		
11	take enforcement action against, arrest, or search a person or vehicle, with or without legal		
12	basis under the Constitution of the United States; and		
13			
14	WHEREAS, complaints surrounding motorcycle profiling have been cited in all fifty		
15	states; and		
16			
17	WHEREAS, nationwide protests to raise awareness and combat motorcycle profiling		
18	have been held in multiple states:

20	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of		
21	Representatives of the One Hundred Second General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the		
22	Senate concurring therein, hereby:

24	(1) Support increased public awareness on the issue of motorcycle profiling;

26	(2) Encourage collaboration and communication with the motorcycle community and		

27 law enforcement to engage in efforts to end motorcycle profiling; and
