INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE PETERS.

2	WHEREAS, the Yulin Lychee and Dog Meat Festival is held in Yulin, China during the summer of each year; and

4 5	WHEREAS, the festival spans 10 days and it is estimated that over 10,000 dogs are consumed by attendees; and

7 8	WHEREAS, witnesses have stated that some of the dogs eaten were most likely household pets, based on their collars; and

10 11 12	WHEREAS, in 2015 an online petition in the United Kingdom gathered over 4 million signatures and in 2016 an international petition in opposition to the festival reportedly gathered 11 million signatures; and

14	WHEREAS, dog meat has been consumed in China for over 400 years; and

16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, consuming dog meat puts individuals at risk of infection from such deadly parasites as E. Coli and salmonella, commonly found in contaminated meats, as well as at risk of contracting other serious and potentially deadly bacterial diseases such as anthrax, brucellosis, hepatitis, and leptospirosis; and

21 22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, dog meat is additionally linked to the spread of rabies, a disease that kills approximately 10,000 dogs and 350 people per year in the Philippines. Evidence shows that rabies is present and potentially transmitted throughout all stages of the dog meat industry, sourcing, trading, slaughtering, and consumption, impeding efforts towards eradicating rabies in the region:
