AN ACT

To repeal section 311.462, RSMo, relating to the transportation of wine.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 311.462, RSMo, is repealed to read as follows:

[311.462. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
2 a holder of a retailer alcoholic beverage license in this state or a
3 state which affords Missouri licensees an equal reciprocal shipping
4 privilege may ship, for personal use and not for resale, not more
5 than two cases of wine, each case containing not more than nine
6 liters, per year to any adult resident of this state. Delivery of a
7 shipment pursuant to this section shall not be deemed to constitute
8 a sale in this state.

9 2. The shipping container of any wine sent into or out of
10 this state under this section shall be clearly labeled to indicate that
11 the package cannot be delivered to a person under the age of
12 twenty-one years or to an intoxicated person.

13 3. No broker within this state may solicit consumers to
14 engage in interstate reciprocal wine shipments under this
15 section. No shipper located outside this state may advertise such
16 interstate reciprocal wine shipments in this state.]
