## **AN ACT**

To repeal section 43.150, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to discipline procedures for the highway patrol, with existing penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Section 43.150, RSMo, is repealed and one new
- 2 section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 43.150,
- 3 to read as follows:
- 43.150. 1. After a probation period of one year the
- 2 members of the patrol shall be subject to removal, reduction
- 3 in rank or suspension of more than three days only for cause
- 4 after a formal charge has been filed in writing before or by
- 5 the superintendent and upon a [finding] recommendation by a
- 6 majority of a board of six members randomly selected from
- 7 troops or divisions other than that of the accused. The
- 8 board shall be composed of six unbiased members including
- 9 one nonvoting captain, one sergeant and four members of the
- 10 same rank as the accused member. The randomly selected
- 11 captain shall serve as presiding officer at the hearing.
- 12 Within thirty days after the petition is filed, unless the
- 13 accused consents to an extension of time, the board shall
- 14 conduct a hearing and report to the superintendent the
- 15 [finding] recommendation by the majority of the board,
- 16 whether the charges are true and recommend to the
- 17 superintendent what discipline, if any, should be imposed.
- 18 All lawful rules, regulations, and orders of the

19 superintendent shall be obeyed by the members of the patrol

20 who shall be subject to dismissal [as provided] or to one or

- 21 more of the following:
- 22 (1) Suspension not to exceed thirty days;
- 23 (2) Fine;
- 24 (3) Reduction in rank; or
- 25 (4) Disciplinary transfer at the member's expense;
- 26 as the superintendent may [adjudge] order. Nothing in this
- 27 section shall be construed to prevent nondisciplinary
- 28 transfers of members if the superintendent determines that
- 29 such transfers are for the good of the patrol. No hearings
- 30 shall be required in the case of reprimands or suspensions
- 31 of three days or less which may be imposed at the discretion
- 32 of the superintendent.
- 33 2. Subject to the exceptions set forth in subsection
- 34 3, if a complaint is filed against a member, the member will
- 35 be provided a copy of the complaint promptly after the
- 36 complaint is filed by or received by the patrol. Unless the
- 37 member consents in writing to an earlier time, the member
- 38 will not be interrogated by the patrol or ordered to respond
- 39 in writing in connection with the complaint until forty-
- 40 eight hours after the member has received a copy of the
- 41 complaint. The member will be entitled to reasonable
- 42 opportunity to have counsel present during any interrogation
- 43 related to the complaint. Prior to the superintendent or
- 44 the patrol making an initial recommendation of discipline,
- 45 the member shall be entitled to a copy of any investigation
- 46 reports and any other written or recorded information or
- 47 other evidence reviewed by the patrol which relates to the
- 48 complaint; and the member will be afforded an opportunity to
- 49 present a written response thereto.

3. Notwithstanding any provisions in the preceding subsection, the superintendent may postpone notifying the member that a complaint has been filed and may withhold the complaint and part or all of the investigation report and other evidence if the superintendent determines that such disclosures will seriously interfere with the investigation regarding that complaint or any other investigation being conducted by the patrol or will likely jeopardize the health or safety of any person. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to limit the rights of parties to discovery in civil or criminal litigation.
