| 12 | "52-2-112. Duty to strengthen child welfare services. (1) The department shall make provision                       |
| 13 | provide for establishing and strengthening child welfare services, including protective services as defined in      |
| 14 | 41-3-102, and for care of children in registered or licensed family foster homes, child-care agencies, group        |
| 15 | homes, or treatment facilities.   |
| 16 | (2) To carry out its duties under Title 41, chapter 3, and this part, the department shall establish and            |
| 17 | maintain an appropriately staffed office at a physical location in the county seat of each county with a population |
| 18 | of at least 9,000. An office must have scheduled office hours:  |
| 19 | (a) at least 2 days a week MONTH in a county with a population of 9,000 to 12,000, AS DETERMINED BY THE             |

The department</u> 7 of public health and human services shall: 8 (1) adopt rules for the admission, custody, transfer, and release of persons in department programs 9 except as otherwise provided by law. However, rules adopted by the department may not amend or alter the 10 statutory powers and duties of the board of pardons and parole. 11 (2) subject to the functions of the department of administration, lease or purchase lands for use by 12 institutions and classify those lands to determine those that may be most profitably used for agricultural purposes, 13 taking into consideration the needs of all institutions for the food products that can be grown or produced on the 14 lands and the relative value of agricultural programs in the treatment or rehabilitation of the persons confined in 15 the institutions: 16 (3) use the staff and services of other state agencies and units of the Montana university system, within 17 their respective statutory functions, to carry out its functions under this title; 18 (4) propose programs to the legislature to meet the projected long-range needs of institutions, including 19 programs and facilities for the diagnosis, treatment, care, and aftercare of persons placed in institutions; and 20 (5) encourage the establishment of programs at the local level for the prevention and rehabilitation of 21 disabilities as they relate to mental illness and chemical dependency. The department shall require a provider 22 of mental illness or chemical dependency treatment services to establish and maintain a program at a physical 23 location in the county seat of each county with a population of at least 12,000. The program must have scheduled 24 hours at least 3 days a week."

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**Section 2.** Section 53-2-301, MCA, is amended to read:

"53-2-301. Local offices of public assistance to be established by department. (1) The department shall establish one or more local offices of public assistance in each county of the state. If Except as provided in subsection (2), if conditions warrant, two or more counties may be combined into one administrative unit and the department may use the same local office of public assistance and staff to administer public assistance in

1 the combined counties. 2 (2) The department shall establish and maintain an appropriately staffed office at a physical location in 3 the county seat of each county with a population of at least 9,000. An office must have scheduled office hours: 4 (a) at least 2 days 1 DAY a week MONTH in a county with a population of 9,000 to 12,000; and 5 (b) at least 4 2 days a week MONTH in a county with a population of 12,000 or more." 6 7 Section 4. Section 53-20-205, MCA, is amended to read: 8 "53-20-205. Community services. (1) The department may establish and administer community 9 comprehensive services, programs, clinics, or other facilities throughout the state for the purpose of aiding in the 10 prevention, diagnosis, amelioration, or treatment of developmental disabilities. Programs, clinics, or other services 11 may be provided directly by state agencies or indirectly through contract or cooperative arrangements with other 12 agencies of government, regional or local, private or public agencies, private professional persons, or accredited 13 health or long-term care facilities. 14 (2) (a) The department may contract for programs for developmental disabilities services. Contracts 15 entered into by the department must contain specific conditions for performance by the contractor, including a 16 requirement that, at a minimum, a contractor serving any region of the state provide a full array of services at a 17 physical location in the county seat of each county in the region with a population of at least 12,000. 18 (b) The department shall set minimum standards for programs and establish appropriate qualifications 19 for persons employed in the programs. 20 (3) All developmental disabilities facilities and services must comply with existing federal guidelines and 21 with requirements that will enable the services and facilities to qualify for available aid funds. However, this 22 section does not require facilities serving persons with developmental disabilities to meet the same or equal 23 standards as licensed medical facilities unless the developmental disabilities facility is providing professional or 24 skilled medical care. 25 <del>(4) Comprehensive services, programs, clinics, or other facilities established or provided by the</del> 26 department under this part must conform as nearly as possible to the plans of the council created under 27 <del>2-15-1869.</del> 28 (5) The department may promote scientific and medical research investigations relative to the incidence, 29 cause, prevention, and care of persons with developmental disabilities."
