4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING THE USE OF TOW TRUCK DISPATCH AND TOWING
5	SERVICES; PROHIBITING THE USE OF CERTAIN TOWING DISPATCH SERVICES; AND PROHIBITING THE
6	OFFERING OR ACCEPTING OF INCENTIVES FOR USE OF CERTAIN TOW TRUCK DISPATCH AND
7	TOWING SERVICES."

9	WHEREAS, a contract entered into with a third-party towing dispatch service could result in the third-party
10	towing dispatch service controlling rates, levels of service, and use of the rotation system; and
11	WHEREAS, the only incentive to request or authorize the towing or removal of a parked, wrecked,
12	disabled, or abandoned vehicle from the public right-of-way or private property is that the vehicle is towed or
13	removed; and
14	WHEREAS, Montana consumers should be protected from inflated and unnecessary costs associated
15	with third-party towing dispatch services and certain incentives related to towing vehicles and impounding,
16	recovering, and storing towed vehicles.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
19	
20	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Third-party towing dispatch contracts prohibited incentives for use
21	of services prohibited exceptions. (1) A private entity that offers third-party towing dispatch services may
22	not enter into a contract for the provision of those services with a public agency or private person or entity
23	authorized to request removal of a vehicle.
24	(2) A commercial tow truck operator may not:
25	(a) offer to a public agency or private person or entity authorized to request removal of a vehicle a reward
26	or other benefit, other than removal of the vehicle, for using the commercial tow truck operator's services;
27	(b) offer to an owner or person in lawful possession or control of private property a reward or other
28	benefit, other than removal of a vehicle, for using the commercial tow truck operator's services; or
29	(c) accept a reward or other benefit for using the services of a private entity that offers third-party towing
30	dispatch services.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "reward or other benefit" means a monetary or nonmonetary incentive for use of a particular service.

- (4) This section may not be construed to prohibit:
- (a) a commercial tow truck operator or group of commercial tow truck operators from entering into a contract or agreement in which the operator or group of operators compensates a private entity for providing dispatch services;
 - (b) a commercial tow truck operator from receiving compensation owed to the operator for services provided and all charges incurred for the towing, impoundment, recovery, and storage of a parked, wrecked, disabled, or abandoned vehicle or for the removal of another object creating a hazard on the public roadways or private property.
