33 absences as follows:



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(1) a-A minimum of two excused absences each academic year for religious		
observances required by the faith of a student or the student's		
parents.observances.		
(2) Whenever a student is unable to attend class because of a legislative event.		
The rules may require that the student's parents give the principal written notice of the request		
for an excused absence a reasonable time prior to the religious observance. observance of		
legislative event. The student shall be given the opportunity to make up any tests or other world		
missed due to an excused absence for a religious observance.observance or legislative event.		
(d) <u>Duties of School Officials.</u> – It shall be the duty of all school officials to carry out		
such instructions from the State Board of Education, and any school official failing to carry out		
such instructions shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor: Provided, that the compulsory		
attendance law herein prescribed shall not be in force in any local school administrative unit that		
has a higher compulsory attendance feature than that provided herein."		
SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-382.5 reads as rewritten:		
"§ 115C-382.5. Student attendance recognition programs.		
Local boards of education are encouraged to adopt a student attendance recognition program		
within the local school administrative unit to promote student attendance in school ar		
participation in class as an integral part of academic achievement and the learning process. If the		
local board of education adopts a student attendance recognition program, a student with a		
absence resulting from service as a legislative page or a Governor's page or because of an excuse		
absence identified in G.S. 115C-379(c) shall be eligible for participation in the program and the		
student's absence shall not be included as part of the student's record of attendance for the		
purposes of the program."		
SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with		
the 2019-2020 school year.
