Prior to exercising an exemption authorized under this 18 subsection, the North Carolina State Ports Authority, through its Executive Director, shall give 19 notice in writing of the Authority's intent to exercise the exemption to the Secretary of 20 Administration. The notice shall contain, at a minimum, the following information: (i) the 21 specific statutory requirement or requirements from which the Authority intends to exercise an 22 exemption; (ii) the reason the exemption is necessary to expedite delivery of a port facility; and 23 (iii) the way the Authority anticipates the exemption will expedite the delivery of a port facility. 24 The Authority shall report quarterly to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental 25 Operations on any building contracts exceeding two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) 26 to which an exemption authorized by this subsection is applied applied within 60 days of signing 27 the contract." 28 29 ELIMINATE REPORTING REQUIREMENT ON PROJECTS LET WITHOUT A 30 **PERFORMANCE BOND** 31 SECTION 16. Section 1.2 of S.L. 2010-148 reads as rewritten: 32 "SECTION 1.2. The Department of Transportation ("DOT"), The University of North 33 Carolina and its constituent institutions ("UNC"), and the Department of Administration 34 ("DOA") shall monitor all projects in those agencies and institutions that are let without a 35 performance or payment bond to determine the number of defaults on those projects, the cost to 36 complete each defaulted project, and each project's contract price. Beginning March 1, 2011, 37 and annually thereafter, DOT, UNC, and DOA shall report this information to the Joint 38 Legislative Committee on Governmental Operations." 39 40 **REPEAL BID THRESHOLD INCREASE REPORT** 41 SECTION 17.
