5	SECTION 1. The Charter of the Town of Elon, being Chapter 109 of the Session		
6	Laws of 1985, as amended, is amended by adding a new Article to read as follows:		
7		"Article VI. MISCELLANEOUS.	
8	"Sec. 6.1. (a) The board of aldermen may provide by ordinance that each hour a vehicle		
9	remains illegally parked in an on-street parking space is a separate offense, and the violator may		
10	be given a ticket for each offense.

12	for a parking violation is to be held until the towing fee and penalties related to all outstanding		
13	parking ticke	ts and parking penalties owed to the Town are paid in full, or a bond is post	ed in the
