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4 SECTION 2. Representatives of the North Carolina Academy of Family Physicians, 5 the North Carolina Medical Society, the North Carolina Pediatric Society, the North Carolina 6 Association of Community Pharmacists, and the North Carolina Retail Merchants Association 7 are directed to cooperate and collaborate to recommend a minimum standard screening 8 questionnaire and safety procedures for written protocols for vaccinations or immunizations 9 administered under G.S. 90-85.15B(b)(6)-(7). The questionnaire and recommended standards 10 shall be submitted to the North Carolina Board of Medicine, the North Carolina Board of 11 Nursing, the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy, and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services on or before August 1, 2019. In the event that the questionnaire 12 13 and recommended standards are not submitted by August 1, 2019, the Immunization Branch of 14 the North Carolina Division of Public Health shall develop the questionnaire and recommended standards and submit them to the North Carolina Board of Medicine, the North Carolina Board 15 16 of Nursing, the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy, and the Joint Legislative Oversight 17 Committee on Health and Human Services by September 15, 2019.

18 SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on October 1, 2019, and the 19 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
