1	Whereas, because of their sensitivity to contaminants in the environment and the ease		
2	with which they can be observed and monitored, ospreys can serve as an excellent indicator of		
3	the health of the environment; and		
4	Whereas, the U.S. osprey population has been increasing steadily since 1960 when i		
5	was at an all-time low, which was attributed to the peak of the use of harmful pesticides, which		
6	were leeching into U.S. waterways; and		
7	Whereas, the resiliency of the osprey reflects the spirit of the "Tar Heel nature" of the		
8	people of the State of North Carolina; and		
9	Whereas, North Carolina does not have an official State raptor; Now, therefore,		
10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
11	SECTION 1. Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new		
12	section to read:		
13	" <u>§ 145-52. State raptor.</u>		
14	The osprey (Pandion haliaetus carolinensis) is adopted as the official raptor of the State of		
15	North Carolina."		
16	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
