A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO LAUNCH A STATEWIDE FIREARM SAFE STORAGE AWARENESS
INITIATIVE TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF THE SAFE
STORAGE OF FIREARMS AND TO FACILITATE THE DISTRIBUTION OF GUN
LOCKS.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** Firearm Safe Storage Awareness Initiative. – The Department of 8 Health and Human Services (Department) shall launch a two-year statewide firearm safe storage 9 awareness initiative to educate the public about the importance of the safe storage of firearms 10 and to facilitate the distribution of gun locks. The initiative required under this section shall 11 include the development of (i) the Web site and toolkit required under Section 2 of this act and 12 (ii) the outreach process required under Section 3 of this act.

13 **SECTION 2.** Development of Web Site and Toolkit. – The Department shall develop 14 a Web site to provide information to the public about (i) the importance of the safe storage of a firearm, especially with respect to access by children and youth; (ii) methods for safely storing a 15 firearm; (iii) contact information for obtaining free gun locks, if available; (iv) information on 16 17 State laws related to the safe storage of firearms; (v) links to Web pages for various resources 18 related to firearm safety such as resources addressing domestic violence, hunter education, and 19 suicide prevention; and (vi) access to a toolkit of information that local communities may use to 20 launch firearm safe storage initiatives at the local level. The toolkit shall provide materials and 21 resources that may be tailored to a community's needs and used for launching local education and awareness campaigns, events, and local groups focused on firearm safe storage and the 22 23 distribution of free or discounted gun locks. The Web site and toolkit required under this section 24 shall be developed by July 1, 2020.

SECTION 3. Development of State-Coordinated Outreach. – Upon development of the Web site and toolkit required under Section 2 of this act, the Department shall develop and implement an outreach process for disseminating the information and toolkit described in Section 2 of this act to the public and to local communities, as well as the provision of technical assistance to local communities to assist them in utilizing the toolkit to launch local initiatives.

30 SECTION 4. Use of Third-Party Entity. – The Department may contract with a
 31 third-party entity with relevant expertise related to public health and injury prevention to launch
 32 the firearm safe storage awareness initiative required under Section 1 of this act.

33 SECTION 5. Prohibition on Advocacy. – The firearm safe storage awareness
 34 initiative required under Section 1 of this act, and any State funds used to launch and maintain



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1 the initiative, shall not be used to advocate, promote, or lobby for the creation of new, or the 2 revision of existing, laws regulating firearms. The firearm safe storage awareness initiative, and 3 any State funds used to launch or maintain the initiative, shall only be used for the purposes set 4 forth in Sections 2 through 4 of this act and only to explain and promote existing laws regulating 5 firearms and best practices for firearm storage and safety. SECTION 6. Appropriation. – There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 6 7 Department of Health and Human Services the sum of eighty-six thousand five hundred dollars 8 (\$86,500) in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and the sum of sixty-nine thousand 9 two hundred dollars (\$69,200) in nonrecurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year to be used to 10 cover any costs associated with launching the firearm safe storage awareness initiative required 11 under Section 1 of this act, including the purchase and distribution of gun locks. 12 **SECTION 7.** Report. – The Department of Health and Human Services shall submit 13 a report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services detailing

- 14 the Department's progress in meeting the requirement set forth in Section 1 of this act. The report
- 15 required under this section shall be submitted by September 1, 2020. **SECTION 8.** Effective Date. – This act becomes effective July 1, 2019.
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
