30	<b>SECTION 5.</b> Sunset. – Section 3 of this act expires on the date that permanent rules				
31	adopted pursuant to Section 4 of this act become effective. The Council may adopt temporary				
32	rules to implement this act.				

**SECTION 6.** Effective date. – This act becomes effective July 1, 2019.

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
