- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-23 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to property disclosure requirements.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 43-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

- 6 Property disclosure Requirements.
- This section applies to a transaction for the sale, exchange, or purchase of real
 property if:
- 9 <u>a.</u> <u>A licensee represents or assists a party to the transaction; and</u>
- 10b.The real property is an owner-occupied primary residence located in this state11being sold or exchanged by the owner.
- 12 <u>2.</u> <u>Before the parties sign an agreement for the sale, exchange, or purchase of real</u>
- 13 property, the seller shall make a written disclosure to the prospective buyer. The
- 14 written disclosure must include all material facts of which the seller is aware which
- 15 <u>could adversely and significantly affect an ordinary buyer's use and enjoyment of the</u>
- 16 property or any intended use of the property of which the seller is aware. The written
- 17 <u>disclosure must include latent defects, general condition, environmental issues,</u>
- 18 <u>structural systems, and mechanical issues regarding the property. The seller shall</u>
- 19 <u>make the written disclosure in good faith and based upon the best of the seller's</u>
- 20 <u>knowledge at the time of the disclosure.</u>
- 3. Following the sale, exchange, or purchase of real property, a licensee shall retain a
 copy of the written disclosure completed and signed by the seller and signed by the

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1		prospective buyer. The licensee duties under this section do not supersede any other
2		common law or statutory duties.
3	<u>4.</u>	The commission shall establish and make available to licensees a written disclosure
4		form meeting the requirements of this section. In establishing the form, the

5 <u>commission shall consult with stakeholders, such as professional organizations.</u>
