- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend sections 79-1105,
- 2 79-1106, 79-1107, 79-1108, 79-1108.01, 79-1108.02, and 79-1108.03,
- 3 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to state findings; to change
- 4 provisions relating to accelerated or differentiated curriculum
- programs; to require establishment of high-ability-learners' focus
- 6 groups; to provide duties; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
- 7 the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 79-1105, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 79-1105 The State Department of Education has authority to employ a
- 4 full-time consultant trained and experienced in the field of education
- 5 for learners with high ability. Such consultant shall encourage, advise,
- 6 and consult with each school of the state in the development and
- 7 implementation of plans for education of learners with high ability and
- 8 shall monitor the implementation of sections 79-1106 to 79-1108.03 and
- 9 sections 2 and 5 of this act. For purposes of this section, learner with
- 10 high ability has the definition found in section 79-1107.
- 11 Sec. 2. <u>The Legislature finds that:</u>
- 12 (1) School districts should provide for individual student needs and
- 13 the development of extraordinary ability and potential; and
- 14 (2) Educational programs for learners with high ability should be
- 15 based on the beliefs that:
- 16 (a) High performance capability is evident in all races, creeds,
- 17 <u>national origins, genders, physical abilities, and economic strata;</u>
- 18 (b) Learners with high ability come from diverse economic and
- 19 cultural settings and must be identified;
- 20 <u>(c) Learners with high ability should have an education free from</u>
- 21 <u>economic and cultural bias;</u>
- 22 (d) Learners with high ability have unique learning needs and
- 23 services should be provided to address those educational needs;
- 24 (e) Learners with high ability require a variety of challenging
- 25 experiences that will enable them to demonstrate their potential;
- 26 <u>(f) Educators have a responsibility to be adequately trained to meet</u>
- 27 <u>the needs of learners with high ability;</u>
- 28 <u>(g) Community understanding and involvement is critical in the</u>
- 29 <u>education of learners with high ability;</u>
- 30 (h) Parents are valued partners in the education of learners with
- 31 high ability; and

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1 (i) Educational excellence for learners with high ability requires a

- 2 commitment of financial and human resources.
- 3 Sec. 3. Section 79-1106, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 4 amended to read:
- 5 79-1106 The purpose of sections 79-1106 to 79-1108.03 <u>and sections 2</u>
- 6 and 5 of this act is to assist and encourage all school districts in the
- 7 development, improvement, and implementation of accelerated or
- 8 differentiated curriculum programs that will serve the educational needs
- 9 of learners with high ability at levels appropriate for their abilities
- 10 consistent with the findings contained in section 2 of this act.
- 11 Sec. 4. Section 79-1107, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 79-1107 For purposes of sections 79-1106 to 79-1108.03 and sections
- 14 2 and 5 of this act:
- 15 (1) Approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs means
- 16 academic programs that serve the educational needs of learners with high
- 17 ability developed and approved under section 79-1108;
- 18 (2) Department means the State Department of Education; and
- 19 (3) Learner with high ability means a student who gives evidence of
- 20 high performance capability in such areas as intellectual, creative, or
- 21 artistic capacity or in specific academic fields and who requires
- 22 accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs in order to develop
- 23 those capabilities fully.
- 24 Sec. 5. (1) Each school district within a learning community as
- 25 defined in section 79-2101 providing an approved accelerated or
- 26 <u>differentiated curriculum program shall establish a high-ability-</u>
- 27 <u>learners' focus group. Each focus group shall include:</u>
- 28 (a) Parents of learners with high ability from elementary, middle
- 29 <u>school, and high school grade levels as defined by the school district;</u>
- 30 (b) Teachers from an approved accelerated or differentiated
- 31 curriculum program from elementary, middle school, and high school grade

- 1 levels; and
- 2 (c) Administrators with responsibilities directly related to the
- 3 school district's approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum
- 4 programs.
- 5 (2) The focus group may also include a representative from a
- 6 statewide organization which advocates for meeting the educational needs
- 7 of learners with high ability. A preference shall be given in the
- 8 <u>selection of teacher members to teachers with endorsements specific to</u>
- 9 teaching learners with high ability who teach in approved accelerated or
- 10 <u>differentiated curriculum programs in the school district. The majority</u>
- 11 <u>of each focus group shall be made up of parents of learners with high</u>
- 12 ability.
- 13 (3) Each focus group shall:
- 14 (a) Explore ways for parents and students to play an ongoing,
- 15 <u>integral role in the district's approved accelerated or differentiated</u>
- 16 curriculum program;
- 17 <u>(b) Annually receive and review data and reports submitted by the</u>
- 18 school district pursuant to sections 79-1108.01 to 79-1108.03;
- 19 (c) Annually review the expenditure of funds distributed to the
- 20 district pursuant to section 79-1108.02 and the matching funds required
- 21 pursuant to subdivision (2)(b) of such section during the past school
- 22 year and the budgeted expenditures of such funds for the current school
- 23 <u>year; and</u>
- 24 (d) Study any issues related to the education of learners with high
- 25 ability that the focus group deems appropriate.
- Sec. 6. Section 79-1108, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 27 amended to read:
- 28 79-1108 Each school district shall identify learners with high
- 29 ability and may provide approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum
- 30 programs that will address the educational needs of the identified
- 31 students at levels appropriate for the abilities of those students. The

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- 1 accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs shall meet the
- 2 standards of quality established by the department. Educational service
- 3 units may identify learners with high ability and provide approved
- 4 accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs for school districts.
- 5 Accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs provided by a school
- 6 <u>district or an educational service unit shall meet the standards of</u>
- 7 quality established by the department and, if the school district is a
- 8 <u>member of a learning community, establish a high-ability-learners' focus</u>
- 9 group pursuant to section 5 of this act in order to be approved by the
- 10 <u>department</u>.
- 11 Sec. 7. Section 79-1108.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 79-1108.01 <u>Each school district</u> School districts shall annually
- 14 provide the department with a copy of its their criteria for identifying
- 15 learners with high ability, the number of students identified according
- 16 to the criteria, and the number of students participating in an approved
- 17 accelerated or differentiated curriculum program_and shall, if the school
- 18 <u>district is a member of a learning community, annually provide such</u>
- 19 information to the school district's high-ability-learners' focus group.
- 20 <u>Each school district</u> School districts shall also have a list of the
- 21 students identified and how the students compare to the criteria
- 22 available for inspection by department personnel.
- 23 Sec. 8. Section 79-1108.02, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 79-1108.02 (1) The department shall distribute amounts from the
- 26 Education Innovation Fund pursuant to section 9-812 for purposes of
- 27 subsection (2) of this section to local systems as defined in section
- 28 79-1003 annually on or before October 15. The funds distributed pursuant
- 29 to this section shall be distributed based on a pro rata share of the
- 30 eligible costs submitted in grant applications.
- 31 (2) Local systems may apply to the department for base funds and

- 1 matching funds pursuant to this section to be spent on approved
- 2 accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs. Each eligible local
- 3 system shall receive one-tenth of one percent of the appropriation as
- 4 base funds plus a pro rata share of the remainder of the appropriation
- 5 based on identified students participating in an accelerated or
- 6 differentiated curriculum program, up to ten percent of the prior year's
- 7 fall membership as defined in section 79-1003, as matching funds.
- 8 Eligible local systems shall:
- 9 (a) Provide an approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum
- 10 program for students identified as learners with high ability;
- 11 (b) Provide funds from other sources for the approved accelerated or
- 12 differentiated curriculum program greater than or equal to fifty percent
- of the matching funds received pursuant to this subsection;
- 14 (c) Provide an accounting of the funds received pursuant to this
- 15 section, funds required by subdivision (b) of this subsection, and the
- 16 total cost of the program on or before August 1 of the year following the
- 17 receipt of funds in a manner prescribed by the department, not to exceed
- 18 one report per year;
- 19 (d) Provide data to the department and, if the school district is a
- 20 member of a learning community, to the high-ability-learners' focus group
- 21 regarding the academic progress of students participating in the approved
- 22 accelerated or differentiated curriculum program in a manner prescribed
- 23 by the department, not to exceed one report per year; and
- (e) Include identified students from Class I districts that are part
- 25 of the local system in the accelerated or differentiated curriculum
- 26 program.
- 27 If a local system will not be providing the necessary matching funds
- 28 pursuant to subdivision (b) of this subsection, the local system shall
- 29 request a reduction in the amount received pursuant to this subsection
- 30 such that the local system will be in compliance with such subdivision.
- 31 Local systems not complying with the requirements of this subsection

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- 1 shall not be eligible local systems in the following year.
- Sec. 9. Section 79-1108.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 79-1108.03 The State Board of Education shall adopt and promulgate
- 5 rules and regulations to implement sections 79-1105 to 79-1108.03 and
- 6 sections 2 and 5 of this act, including criteria for the approval of
- 7 accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs, for and data
- 8 requirements for measuring academic progress of students participating in
- 9 the accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs, and for protecting
- 10 the personally identifiable information of learners with high ability in
- 11 <u>meeting such reporting requirements</u>.
- 12 Sec. 10. Original sections 79-1105, 79-1106, 79-1107, 79-1108,
- 13 79-1108.01, 79-1108.02, and 79-1108.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 14 Nebraska, are repealed.
