LEGISLATIVE BILL 1081

Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to provide required student-to-
- teacher ratios as prescribed; to provide a reporting requirement;
- and to provide powers and duties to the Commissioner of Education,
- 4 the State Department of Education, and the State Board of Education.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) For purposes of this section:
- 2 (a) Co-taught class means a class taught by one general education
- 3 <u>teacher and one special education teacher who is in the class to provide</u>
- 4 special education instruction and accommodations to students in such
- 5 class with individualized education programs;
- 6 (b) General education class means a class taught by one general
- 7 education teacher who may or may not have the assistance of one or more
- 8 paraprofessionals in the classroom. Students with individualized
- 9 education programs who are in these classes are students who require no
- 10 specialized instruction in the subject-matter being taught, although they
- 11 may require accommodations;
- 12 (c) Special education class means a class that serves only students
- 13 with an individualized education program that have special education
- 14 needs defined by such program; and
- (d) Special education teacher means an individual with a certificate
- to teach who holds an endorsement in special education.
- 17 (2) Beginning with or prior to the 2025-26 school year, each school
- 18 district shall ensure that if a student with a disability as defined in
- 19 section 79-1118.01 is educated with nondisabled students and specially
- 20 <u>designed instruction and supplementary special education services are</u>
- 21 provided in the general education classroom, including, as appropriate,
- 22 resource room programs and special class programs, the appropriate
- 23 student-to-teacher ratio is followed. The appropriate student-to-teacher
- 24 ratios are as follows:
- 25 <u>(a) For a general education class, a maximum class size of twenty-</u>
- 26 four students;
- 27 (b) For a co-taught class, a maximum class size of eighteen students
- 28 and the number of students with an individualized education program in a
- 29 co-taught class shall not exceed thirty percent of the total class size;
- 30 <u>(c) For a special education class:</u>
- 31 (i) Containing a majority of students with academic or behavioral

- 1 management needs which interfere with the instructional process, require
- 2 <u>additional adult support to engage in learning, and require specially</u>
- 3 designed instruction which can best be accomplished in a self-contained
- 4 setting, a maximum class size of twelve students and such class shall
- 5 <u>include one full-time special education teacher and one full-time</u>
- 6 paraprofessional;
- 7 (ii) Containing a majority of students with management needs that
- 8 are severe and chronic and that require intensive constant supervision, a
- 9 significant degree of individualized attention, intervention and
- 10 intensive behavior management, and additional adult support, a maximum
- 11 <u>class size of eight students and such class shall include one full-time</u>
- 12 <u>special education teacher and one full-time paraprofessional;</u>
- 13 <u>(iii) Containing a majority of students with very high needs in most</u>
- 14 or all need areas, including academic, social and interpersonal
- 15 development, and physical development, whose behavior is characterized as
- 16 aggressive or self-abusive, or who have severe difficulties in the
- 17 acquisition and generalization of language and social development, and
- 18 who are best taught in a setting with very intense individual
- 19 programming, continual adult supervision, and specific behavior
- 20 management programs, a maximum class size of six students and such class
- 21 <u>shall include one full-time special education teacher and one full-time</u>
- 22 paraprofessional; and
- 23 (iv) Containing a majority of students with severe and multiple
- 24 <u>disabilities as defined in section 79-1118.01, with limited</u> language
- 25 ability, and who require a program primarily of rehabilitation and
- 26 treatment including training in daily living skills and the development
- 27 of communication skills, sensory stimulation, and therapeutic
- 28 interventions, a maximum class size of twelve students and such class
- 29 shall include one full-time special education teacher and one additional
- 30 staff person, who may be a teacher or a paraprofessional, for every three
- 31 students in such class.

- 1 (3) Each school district shall annually file a report with the State
- 2 Department of Education on forms and in a manner prescribed by the
- 3 department certifying that such school district is in compliance with the
- 4 student-to-teacher ratios required pursuant to this section. A school
- 5 district may apply to the department for an exception waiver to the
- 6 student-to-teacher ratios required pursuant to this section. The
- 7 department may grant a school district a one-year exception waiver to
- 8 exceed the required student-to-teacher ratio, but no school district
- 9 <u>shall receive more than three exception waivers.</u>
- 10 (4) If the Commissioner of Education determines that any school
- 11 <u>district has intentionally refused in a material manner to comply with</u>
- 12 this section, the commissioner shall notify the school district of the
- 13 <u>noncompliance and allow the school district a reasonable time to comply.</u>
- 14 If the commissioner determines, after such time has elapsed, that the
- 15 school district is not in compliance and has not made a good faith
- 16 attempt to comply, the commissioner shall take appropriate remedial
- 17 action within the commissioner's authority, up to and including
- 18 considering such noncompliance as a violation of the rules and
- 19 <u>regulations for the accreditation of schools.</u>
- 20 <u>(5) The State Board of Education may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
- 21 <u>regulations to carry out this section.</u>
