- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to civil liability; to adopt the Online Age
- 2 Verification Liability Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 5 of this act shall be known and may be
- 2 <u>cited as the Online Age Verification Liability Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Online Age Verification Liability Act:
- 4 (1) Commercial entity includes a corporation, limited liability
- 5 <u>company</u>, <u>partnership</u>, <u>limited partnership</u>, <u>sole proprietorship</u>, <u>or other</u>
- 6 legally recognized entity;
- 7 (2) Digitized identification card means a data file that contains
- 8 <u>all of the data elements visible on the face and back of a government-</u>
- 9 issued operator's license or identification card and displays the current
- 10 status of the license or card;
- 11 (3) Distribute means to issue, sell, give, provide, deliver,
- 12 <u>transfer, transmute, circulate, or disseminate by any means;</u>
- 13 (4) Internet utility means an Internet service provider, a search
- 14 engine, or a cloud service provider or an affiliate or subsidiary of any
- 15 such provider or search engine;
- 16 (5) Material harmful to minors means any material to which all of
- 17 the following apply:
- 18 (a) The average person, applying contemporary community standards,
- 19 would find, taking the material as a whole and with respect to its
- 20 consumption by minors, that such material is designed to appeal to or
- 21 pander to the prurient interest;
- 22 (b) The material exploits, is devoted to, or principally consists of
- 23 <u>descriptions or depictions, whether actual, simulated, or animated, of</u>
- 24 any of the following, in a manner patently offensive, with respect to its
- 25 consumption by minors:
- 26 <u>(i) Pubic hair, anus, vulva, genitals, or nipple of the female</u>
- 27 <u>breast;</u>
- 28 (ii) Touching, caressing, or fondling of nipples, breasts, buttocks,
- 29 anuses, or genitals; or
- 30 (iii) Sexual intercourse, masturbation, sodomy, bestiality, oral
- 31 copulation, flagellation, excretory functions, exhibitions, or any other

- 1 sexual act; and
- 2 (c) The material taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic,
- 3 political, or scientific value for minors;
- 4 (6) Minor means any person under eighteen years of age;
- 5 (7) News-gathering organization means any of the following:
- 6 (a) A newspaper, news publication, or news source, printed or on an
- 7 online or mobile platform, of current news and public interest, or any
- 8 <u>employee of such organization while acting within the scope of employment</u>
- 9 <u>for such organization; or</u>
- 10 (b) A radio broadcast station, television broadcast station, cable
- 11 <u>television operator, or wire service operator, or any employee of such</u>
- 12 <u>organization while acting within the scope of employment for such</u>
- 13 <u>organization;</u>
- 14 (8) Publish means to communicate or make information available to
- 15 <u>another person or entity on a publicly available Internet website;</u>
- 16 <u>(9) Reasonable age verification method means a process to verify</u>
- 17 that the person attempting to access the material is at least eighteen
- 18 years of age or older through the use of a digitized identification card,
- 19 <u>a third-party age verification service, or any commercially reasonable</u>
- 20 <u>method that relies on public or private transactional data to verify the</u>
- 21 age of the person attempting to access the material;
- 22 (10) Substantial portion means an amount which is more than one-
- 23 third of the total material on a website; and
- 24 (11) Transactional data means a sequence of information that
- 25 documents an exchange, agreement, or transfer between an individual,
- 26 <u>commercial entity, or third-party used for the purpose of satisfying a</u>
- 27 <u>request or event and includes records from mortgage, education, and</u>
- 28 employment entities.
- 29 Sec. 3. (1) A commercial entity shall not knowingly and
- 30 intentionally publish or distribute material harmful to minors on the
- 31 Internet on a website that contains a substantial portion of such

- 1 material unless the entity uses a reasonable age verification method to
- 2 verify the age of an individual attempting to access the material.
- 3 (2) A commercial entity or third party that performs an age
- 4 verification required by this section shall not retain any identifying
- 5 information of the individual after access has been granted to the
- 6 material.
- 7 Sec. 4. (1) A person aggrieved by a violation of section 3 of this
- 8 act may bring a civil action against the commercial entity or third party
- 9 which engaged in that violation to recover such relief as may be
- 10 appropriate.
- 11 (2) In an action under this section, appropriate relief includes:
- 12 <u>(a) Such preliminary and other equitable or declaratory relief as</u>
- 13 <u>may be appropriate;</u>
- 14 (b) Damages under subsection (3) of this section; and
- (c) At the discretion of the court, reasonable attorney's fees and
- 16 other litigation costs reasonably incurred.
- 17 (3)(a) A minor or a parent or guardian of such minor aggrieved by a
- 18 violation of subsection (1) of section 3 of this act may recover actual
- 19 <u>damages caused by such violation.</u>
- 20 (b) An individual whose information was retained in violation of
- 21 <u>subsection (2) of section 3 of this act may recover actual damages caused</u>
- 22 by such violation.
- 23 Sec. 5. (1) The Online Age Verification Liability Act shall not
- 24 apply to any news-gathering organization or any bona fide news or public
- 25 interest broadcast, website video, or report.
- 26 (2) An Internet utility does not violate the Online Age Verification
- 27 Liability Act solely by providing access or connection to or from a
- 28 website or other information or content on the Internet or a facility,
- 29 system, or network not under the Internet utility's control, including
- 30 transmitting, downloading, or storing data or providing access, to the
- 31 extent that such Internet utility is not responsible for the creation of

1 the content that constitutes material harmful to minors.
