LEGISLATIVE BILL 515

Introduced by Bolz, 29. Read first time January 18, 2017 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend sections 85-1539 and
2	85-1540, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to create the
3	Nebraska Integrated Education and Training Grant Program; to state
4	findings; to define terms; to authorize grants; to require policy
5	recommendations; to require reporting; to state intent to provide an
6	appropriation; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
7	sections.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>The Legislature finds that in order to be competitive in</u>
2	<u>a global economy, Nebraska must develop educational programs in high-</u>
3	demand fields. The Legislature further finds that business interests in
4	<u>Nebraska have identified development of a skilled workforce as essential</u>
5	to building Nebraska's economy. Additionally, the federal Workforce
6	Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, 29 U.S.C. 3101, as such act
7	existed on January 1, 2017, included the first requirement for states to
8	provide integrated education and training services. Finally, community
9	<u>colleges in Nebraska are positioned to establish innovative approaches to</u>
10	developing credentials with meaning in the workforce that meet
11	<u>educational demand.</u>
12	Sec. 2. For purposes of sections 1 to 5 of this act:
13	(1) Adult education means academic instruction and education
14	services below the postsecondary level for any person who is sixteen
15	<u>years of age or older, who is not enrolled in high school and is not</u>
16	required to be enrolled in school, that increase the ability to read,
17	write, and speak in English and perform mathematics or other activities
18	<u>necessary for the attainment of a high school diploma or a diploma of</u>
19	high school equivalency, for the transition to postsecondary education
20	and training, and to obtain employment;
21	(2) Commission means the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary
22	Education;
23	<u>(3) Committee means the Nebraska Community College Student</u>
24	Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee;
25	(4) Integrated education and training means instruction that
26	provides adult education and literacy activities or remedial education
27	concurrently and contextually with workforce preparation activities and
28	workforce training for a specific occupation or occupational cluster for
29	the purpose of educational and career advancement; and
30	(5) Remedial education means instruction and support to prepare a
31	student who is assessed by the postsecondary educational institution that

the student has chosen as being academically underprepared to 1 2 successfully complete a program of study at such postsecondary 3 educational institution. (1) The Nebraska Integrated Education and Training Grant 4 Sec. 3. Program is established. The grant program shall provide grants to 5 community colleges for the purpose of developing and implementing local 6 7 programs of integrated education and training. The committee shall administer the program and shall develop grant applications, procedures, 8 9 and guidelines as needed. 10 (2) The committee shall allocate grants of up to three years to community colleges through a competitive process. To be eligible, a 11 community college shall submit an application to the committee 12 describing: 13 (a) The specific integrated education and training instructional 14 15 model to be implemented by the local program of integrated education and 16 training; 17 (b) How the local program of integrated education and training will be designed and implemented by educators with expertise in adult 18 education and occupational skills training; 19 (c) How the local program of integrated education and training will 20 prepare students to receive a high school diploma or diploma of high 21 22 school equivalency if necessary; (d) How the local program of integrated education and training will 23 24 prepare students to obtain postsecondary credentials; 25 (e) If applicable, how the local program of integrated education and training will offer industry-recognized credentials; 26 27 (f) The occupations or industry for which the local program of integrated education and training will prepare students for employment 28 and how the program will fit into a career pathway; 29 30 (q) Evidence of employer demand for completers of the local program of integrated education and training; 31

(h) How the local program of integrated education and training will 1 provide student support services, including guidance counseling, to 2 3 assist with student success; (i) Strategies for tracking and reporting outcomes and evaluation 4 reporting for the local program of integrated education and training; 5 (j) Evidence of matching funds from local or philanthropic sources 6 7 of at least one quarter of the total projected cost for the local program of integrated education and training; 8 9 (k) Description of target population, such as unemployed, underemployed, low-income, youth, dislocated workers, other, or a 10 combination of target populations and how the local program of integrated 11 12 education and training will serve such target population; and 13 (1) Other information as required by the committee. The commission shall develop an annual evaluation of the 14 Sec. 4. Nebraska Integrated Education and Training Grant Program that includes 15 the following: 16 17 (1) The local programs of integrated education and training that 18 each community college offers by name; (2) The number of students who enrolled in each local program of 19 20 integrated education and training; (3) The number of students who successfully complete each local 21 22 program of integrated education and training; and (4) The percentage of students who obtained employment in the 23 24 occupation or industry indicated in the grant application or who enrolled 25 for additional education related to such occupation or industry within six months after successful completion for each local program of 26 27 integrated education and training. 28 Sec. 5. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate funds to carry out the Nebraska Integrated Education and Training Grant Program 29 from the General Fund. Up to fifteen percent of such funds may be 30 retained by the commission for administering grants, providing technical 31

1 <u>assistance</u>, and conducting the annual evaluation required pursuant to
2 <u>section 4 of this act</u>.

3 Sec. 6. Section 85-1539, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
4 amended to read:

85-1539 (1) There is hereby created the Nebraska Community College 5 Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee. The 6 committee shall consist of (a) a representative of the Coordinating 7 Commission for Postsecondary Education who shall serve as chairperson of 8 9 the committee, (b) a representative of the Department of Economic 10 Development, (c) a representative of the Department of Labor, (d) a representative of the State Department of Education, (e) a representative 11 affiliated with one of the two community college areas with the two 12 13 smallest full-time equivalent student enrollment totals for the most 14 recent fiscal year, (f) a representative affiliated with one of the two community college areas with the two largest full-time equivalent student 15 16 enrollment totals for the most recent fiscal year, and (g) a 17 representative affiliated with one of the two community college areas not included in the categories provided in subdivisions (1)(e) and (f) of 18 19 this section. Each member shall be appointed by the agency or community college areas being represented. The representatives appointed pursuant 20 to subdivisions (1)(e) through (g) of this section shall serve terms of 21 22 two years and shall be succeeded by a representative affiliated with the 23 community college areas not represented for the preceding term. The 24 committee shall administer the grant program provided by subsection (2) of this section and the Nebraska Integrated Education and Training Grant 25 Program pursuant to sections 1 to 5 of this act. 26

(2) The committee shall develop guidelines for and annually
determine the allocation of aid or grants to the community colleges for
(a) applied technology and occupational faculty training, instructional
equipment upgrades, employee assessment, preemployment training,
employment training, and dislocated worker programs benefiting the State

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of Nebraska or (b) programs or activities to enhance (i) student 1 2 performance in the areas of degree, certificate, or diploma completion, retention, or foundations education as defined in section 85-932.01 or 3 4 (ii) the collection, reporting, analysis, and utilization of student 5 data. The total amount allocated for a fiscal year shall not exceed the amounts appropriated from the Nebraska Community College Student 6 7 Performance and Occupational Education Grant Fund and such other funds as may be appropriated by the Legislature for purposes of this section for 8 9 such fiscal year. The commission shall certify the allocation determined by the committee on or before September 10 of the fiscal year for which 10 such allocation is being certified and shall report such allocation to 11 12 the Department of Administrative Services. The commission shall 13 distribute the allocated funds to the selected community college board or 14 boards in a single payment between the fifth and twentieth day of October 15 of each year.

(3) Applications for aid or grants pursuant to <u>subsection (2) of</u>
 this section may be submitted by a community college area independently
 or in collaboration with other community college areas.

Sec. 7. Section 85-1540, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, isamended to read:

85-1540 There is hereby created the Nebraska Community College 21 Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Fund. The fund shall 22 be under the direction of the Nebraska Community College Student 23 24 Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee and shall be administered by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education. 25 The fund shall consist of money received by the state in the form of 26 grants or gifts from nonfederal sources, such other amounts as may be 27 28 transferred or otherwise accrue to the fund, and any investment income earned on the fund. The fund shall be used to provide aid or grants to 29 the community colleges pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) of section 30 85-1539. Any money in the fund available for investment shall be invested 31

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2 Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.

3 Sec. 8. Original sections 85-1539 and 85-1540, Reissue Revised
4 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
