11 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 37-404, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 37-404 (1) Any resident of the United States who has 4 resided in this state continuously for a period of thirty days before 5 applying for a permit under the Game Law and who has a bona fide 6 intention of becoming a legal resident of this state, supported by 7 documentary proof, shall be deemed to be a resident and may be issued 8 a resident permit under the Game Law.

(2) No hunting permit shall be issued to any person who 9 10 is known to have a significant physical or mental disability and who 11 is unable to safely carry or use a firearm because of such 12 disability, except that a hunting permit may be issued to any 13 developmentally disabled person who has a license-purchase exemption certificate issued by the commission authorizing such person to 14 purchase a hunting permit. The commission may adopt and promulgate 15 16 rules and regulations to establish forms and procedures for the 17 issuance of license-purchase exemption certificates. Any licensepurchase exemption certificate issued pursuant to this subsection 18 19 shall be issued at no cost to the developmentally disabled person and 20 shall clearly state on its face that the holder must at all times 21 while hunting be accompanied as defined in subsection (4) of section 22 37-413 by a person who is not also developmentally disabled. If a 23 developmentally disabled person who holds a license-purchase exemption certificate is incapable of obtaining a certificate of 24 25 successful completion of hunter education under section 37-413, he or

she shall be exempt from the hunter education requirements of section 1 2 37-413. No license-purchase exemption certificate shall be issued to 3 any person who has been found by any court or mental health board to 4 pose a current danger to himself or herself or others. As part of the 5 application process for a license-purchase exemption certificate, a 6 developmentally disabled person shall present the commission with a 7 written authorization signed by a physician indicating that the 8 developmentally disabled person is at all times capable of 9 understanding and following directions given by another person and 10 that the developmentally disabled person is not currently a danger to himself or herself or others. For purposes of this section, 11 12 developmentally disabled person means a person who has a 13 developmental disability as defined in section 83-1205.

14 (3) The commission may limit the number of days for which 15 a permit is issued and the number of fish or game birds taken on one 16 permit. The commission may provide for a method of tagging and 17 identification of fish and game birds taken under a nonresident 18 permit.

Sec. 2. Section 37-413, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

21 37-413 (1) For the purpose of establishing and 22 administering a mandatory firearm hunter education program for 23 persons twelve through twenty-nine years of age who hunt with a 24 firearm or crossbow hunting implement any species of game, game 25 birds, or game animals, the commission shall provide a program of

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firearm hunter education training leading to obtaining a certificate 1 2 of successful completion in the safe handling of firearms a hunting 3 implement and shall locate and train volunteer firearm hunter 4 education instructors. The program shall provide a training course 5 having a minimum of (a) ten hours of classroom instruction or (b) 6 independent study on the part of the student sufficient to pass an 7 examination given by the commission followed by such student's 8 participation in a minimum of four hours of practical instruction. 9 The program at a minimum shall provide instruction in the areas of safe firearms use of a hunting implement, shooting and sighting 10 techniques, hunter ethics, game identification, and conservation 11 12 management. The commission shall issue a firearm hunter education 13 certificate of successful completion to persons having satisfactorily completed a firearm hunter education course accredited by the 14 15 commission and shall print, purchase, or otherwise acquire materials 16 as necessary for effective program operation. The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for carrying out and 17 18 administering such programs. this section.

19 (2) It shall be unlawful for any person twenty-nine years
20 of age or younger to hunt with a <u>firearm or crossbow hunting</u>
21 <u>implement any species of game, game birds, or game animals except:</u>

(a) A person under the age of twelve years who is
accompanied by a person nineteen years of age or older having a valid
hunting permit; as defined in subsection (4) of this section; and
(b)(i) A person twelve through twenty-nine years of age

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who has on his or her person proof of successful completion of a hunter education course <u>as described in subsection (1) of this</u> <u>section</u> or a <u>firearm</u> hunter education course issued by the person's state or province of residence or by an accredited program recognized by the commission; or

6 (c) (ii) A person twelve through twenty-nine years of age 7 who has on his or her person the appropriate hunting permit and an 8 apprentice hunter education exemption certificate issued by the 9 commission pursuant to subsection (3) of this section and who is 10 accompanied as described in subsection (4) of this section.

11 (3) An apprentice hunter education exemption certificate 12 may be issued to a person twelve through twenty-nine years of age, 13 once during such person's lifetime with one renewal, upon payment of a fee of five dollars and shall expire at midnight on December 31 of 14 15 the year for which the apprentice hunter education exemption 16 certificate is issued. The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations allowing for the issuance of apprentice hunter 17 education exemption certificates. All fees collected under this 18 19 subsection shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the 20 State Game Fund.

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(4) For purposes of this section: , accompanied

22 (a) Accompanied means under the direct supervision of a 23 person who is: (a) (i) Nineteen years of age or older having a valid 24 hunting permit. If such person is nineteen years of age or older but 25 not older than twenty-nine years of age, he or she shall have also

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completed the required course of instruction to receive a certificate 1 2 of completion for firearm hunter education if hunting with a firearm 3 or crossbow as described in subdivision (2)(b) of this section or for 4 bow hunter education if hunting with a bow and arrow as described in 5 section 37-414; hunting implement; and (b) (ii) at all times in б unaided visual and verbal communication of no more than two persons 7 having an apprentice hunter education exemption certificate. This 8 subsection subdivision does not prohibit the use by such person 9 nineteen years of age or older of ordinary prescription eyeglasses or 10 contact lenses or ordinary hearing instruments; and \div 11 (b) Hunting implement means a firearm, crossbow, bow and 12 arrow, or air gun used to hunt. 13 Sec. 3.
