**LEGISLATIVE BILL 880**

Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend section 80-414,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 60-3,122.03,
- 3 60-3,122.04, and 60-4,189, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 4 2014; to change provisions relating to Military Honor Plates and the
- 5 notation of veteran status on operator's licenses and state
- 6 identification cards; to harmonize provisions; to provide an
- 7 operative date; and to repeal the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-3,122.03, Revised Statutes Cumulative  
2 Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:

3 60-3,122.03 (1) The department shall design license plates to be  
4 known as Military Honor Plates. The department shall create designs  
5 honoring persons who have served or are serving in the United States  
6 Army, United States Army Reserve, United States Navy, United States Navy  
7 Reserve, United States Marine Corps, United States Marine Corps Reserve,  
8 United States Coast Guard, United States Coast Guard Reserve, United  
9 States Air Force, United States Air Force Reserve, or National Guard.  
10 There shall be eleven ~~six~~ designs, one for each of such armed forces  
11 reflecting its official emblem, official seal, or other official image.  
12 The issuance of plates for each of such armed forces shall be conditioned  
13 on the approval of the armed forces owning the copyright to the official  
14 emblem, official seal, or other official image. A person may qualify for  
15 a Military Honor Plate by registering with the Department of Veterans'  
16 Affairs pursuant to section 80-414. The Department of Motor Vehicles  
17 shall verify the applicant's eligibility for a plate created pursuant to  
18 this section by consulting the registry established by the Department of  
19 Veterans' Affairs.

20 (2) The design shall be selected on the basis of limiting the  
21 manufacturing cost of each plate to an amount less than or equal to the  
22 amount charged for license plates pursuant to section 60-3,102. The  
23 Department of Motor Vehicles shall make applications available for each  
24 type of plate when it is designed. The department may adopt and  
25 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section and section  
26 60-3,122.04.

27 (3) One type of Military Honor Plates shall be alphanumeric plates.  
28 The department shall:

29 (a) Assign a designation up to five characters; and

30 (b) Not use a county designation.

31 (4) One type of Military Honor Plates shall be personalized message

1 plates. Such plates shall be issued subject to the same conditions  
2 specified for personalized message license plates in section 60-3,118,  
3 except that a maximum of five characters may be used.

4 Sec. 2. Section 60-3,122.04, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,  
5 2014, is amended to read:

6 60-3,122.04 (1) ~~An Beginning January 2, 2016,~~ an eligible person may  
7 apply to the department for Military Honor Plates in lieu of regular  
8 license plates on an application prescribed and provided by the  
9 department for any motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or cabin trailer,  
10 except for a motor vehicle or trailer registered under section 60-3,198.  
11 An applicant receiving a Military Honor Plate for a farm truck with a  
12 gross weight of over sixteen tons shall affix the appropriate tonnage  
13 decal to the plate. The department shall make forms available for such  
14 applications through the county treasurers. The license plates shall be  
15 issued upon payment of the license fee described in subsection (2) of  
16 this section and verification by the department of an applicant's  
17 eligibility using the registry established by the Department of Veterans'  
18 Affairs pursuant to section 80-414. To be eligible an applicant shall be  
19 (a) active duty or reserve duty armed forces personnel serving in any of  
20 the armed forces listed in subsection (1) of section 60-3,122.03 or (b) a  
21 veteran of any of such armed forces who was discharged or otherwise  
22 separated with a characterization of honorable or general (under  
23 honorable conditions). Any person using Military Honor Plates shall  
24 surrender the plates to the county treasurer if such person is no longer  
25 eligible for the plates. Regular plates shall be issued to any such  
26 person upon surrender of the Military Honor Plates for a three-dollar  
27 transfer fee and forfeiture of any of the remaining annual fee. The  
28 three-dollar transfer fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for  
29 credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

30 (2)(a) In addition to all other fees required for registration under  
31 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance

1 or renewal of alphanumeric Military Honor Plates shall be accompanied by  
2 a fee of five dollars. County treasurers collecting fees pursuant to this  
3 subdivision shall remit them to the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer  
4 shall credit five dollars of the fee to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery  
5 System Operation Fund.

6 (b) In addition to all other fees required for registration under  
7 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance  
8 or renewal of personalized message Military Honor Plates shall be  
9 accompanied by a fee of forty dollars. County treasurers collecting fees  
10 pursuant to this subdivision shall remit them to the State Treasurer. The  
11 State Treasurer shall credit twenty-five percent of the fee for initial  
12 issuance and renewal of such plates to the Department of Motor Vehicles  
13 Cash Fund and seventy-five percent of the fee to the Nebraska Veteran  
14 Cemetery System Operation Fund.

15 (3) When the Department of Motor Vehicles receives an application  
16 for Military Honor Plates, the department shall deliver the plates to the  
17 county treasurer of the county in which the motor vehicle or cabin  
18 trailer is registered. The county treasurer shall issue Military Honor  
19 Plates in lieu of regular license plates when the applicant complies with  
20 the other provisions of the Motor Vehicle Registration Act for  
21 registration of the motor vehicle or cabin trailer. If Military Honor  
22 Plates are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the licensee shall be issued  
23 replacement license plates upon request pursuant to section 60-3,157.

24 (4) The owner of a motor vehicle or cabin trailer bearing Military  
25 Honor Plates may apply to the county treasurer to have such plates  
26 transferred to a motor vehicle other than the vehicle for which such  
27 plates were originally purchased if such vehicle is owned by the owner of  
28 the plates. The owner may have the unused portion of the fee for the  
29 plates credited to the other vehicle which will bear the plates at the  
30 rate of eight and one-third percent per month for each full month left in  
31 the registration period. Application for such transfer shall be

1 accompanied by a fee of three dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this  
2 subsection shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the  
3 Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

4 (5) If the cost of manufacturing Military Honor Plates at any time  
5 exceeds the amount charged for license plates pursuant to section  
6 60-3,102, any money to be credited to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery  
7 System Operation Fund shall instead be credited first to the Highway  
8 Trust Fund in an amount equal to the difference between the manufacturing  
9 costs of Military Honor Plates and the amount charged pursuant to section  
10 60-3,102 with respect to such plates and the remainder shall be credited  
11 to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery System Operation Fund.

12 (6) If the director discovers evidence of fraud in an application  
13 for Military Honor Plates or that the holder is no longer eligible to  
14 have Military Honor Plates, the director may summarily cancel the plates  
15 and registration and send notice of the cancellation to the holder of the  
16 license plates.

17 Sec. 3. Section 60-4,189, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,  
18 2014, is amended to read:

19 60-4,189 (1) An operator's license or a state identification card  
20 shall include a notation of the word "veteran" on the front of the  
21 license or card as directed by the department if the individual applying  
22 for such license or card is eligible for the license or card and (a) has  
23 served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, ~~other~~  
24 ~~than active duty for training,~~ and was discharged or otherwise separated  
25 with a characterization of honorable or general (under honorable  
26 conditions) from such service, (b) registers with the Department of  
27 Veterans' Affairs pursuant to section 80-414 as verification of such  
28 service, and (c) indicates on the application under section 60-484 his or  
29 her wish to include such notation on his or her license or card.

30 (2) The Department of Motor Vehicles shall consult the registry  
31 established pursuant to section 80-414 before placing the notation of the

1 word "veteran" on the operator's license or state identification card  
2 issued to the applicant. Such notation shall not be authorized unless the  
3 registry verifies the applicant's eligibility. If the Director of Motor  
4 Vehicles discovers evidence of fraud in an application under this  
5 section, the director may summarily cancel the license or state  
6 identification card and send notice of the cancellation to the licensee  
7 or cardholder. If the Department of Motor Vehicles has information that  
8 an individual is no longer eligible for the notation, the department may  
9 summarily cancel the license and send notice of the cancellation to the  
10 licensee or cardholder. The notation shall not be restored until the  
11 Department of Motor Vehicles subsequently verifies the applicant's  
12 eligibility by consulting the registry of the Department of Veterans'  
13 Affairs.

14 (3) The notation authorized in subsection (1) of this section shall  
15 continue to be included on the license or card upon renewal of such  
16 license or card if the licensee or cardholder, at the time of renewal,  
17 indicates the desire to include the notation.

18 (4) An individual may obtain a replacement operator's license or  
19 state identification card to add or remove the notation authorized in  
20 subsection (1) of this section by applying to the Department of Motor  
21 Vehicles for such replacement license or card and, if adding the  
22 notation, by meeting the requirements of subsection (1) of this section.  
23 The fee for such replacement license or card shall be the fee provided in  
24 section 60-4,115.

25 Sec. 4. Section 80-414, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is  
26 amended to read:

27 80-414 (1) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall create and  
28 maintain a registry of residents of Nebraska who meet the requirements of  
29 subdivision (1)(a) or (b) of section 60-3,122.04 or subsection (1) of  
30 section 60-4,189. The Department of Veterans' Affairs may adopt and  
31 promulgate rules and regulations governing the establishment and

1 maintenance of the registry. The registry may be used to assist the  
2 department in carrying out the duties of the department and shall provide  
3 for the collection of sufficient information to identify an individual  
4 who qualifies for Military Honor Plates or a notation of "veteran" on his  
5 or her operator's license or state identification card issued by the  
6 Department of Motor Vehicles. The registry may include information such  
7 as identifying information on an individual, an individual's records on  
8 active duty or reserve duty in the armed forces of the United States, or  
9 an individual's status of active duty, reserve duty, retired, discharged,  
10 or other.

11 (2) Any resident of Nebraska who meets the requirements of  
12 subdivision (1)(a) or (b) of section 60-3,122.04 or subsection (1) of  
13 section 60-4,189 shall register with the Department of Veterans' Affairs  
14 using the registry created by this section before being eligible for  
15 Military Honor Plates or a notation of "veteran" on his or her operator's  
16 license or state identification card issued by the Department of Motor  
17 Vehicles. No person shall be deemed eligible until his or her status has  
18 been verified on the registry.

19 (3) The Department of Motor Vehicles may adopt and promulgate rules  
20 and regulations governing use of the registry of the Department of  
21 Veterans' Affairs for determination of eligibility for the issuance of  
22 Military Honor Plates or the notation of "veteran" on operators' licenses  
23 and state identification cards.

24 Sec. 5. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2017.

25 Sec. 6. Original section 80-414, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
26 Nebraska, and sections 60-3,122.03, 60-3,122.04, and 60-4,189, Revised  
27 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, are repealed.
