Section 1. Section 38-1101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is 1 2 amended to read: 38-1101 Sections 38-1101 to 38-1151 and sections 3, 5 to 8, 10 to 3 12, 15, 19, and 21 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the 4 Dentistry Practice Act. 5 Sec. 2. 11 (7) The performance by a licensed dental hygienist, under the 12 supervision of a licensed dentist, of the oral prophylaxis procedure 13 which shall include the scaling and polishing of teeth and such 14 additional procedures as are prescribed in accordance with rules and 15 regulations adopted by the department;

(8) The performance, under the supervision of a licensed dentist, by
 a dental assistant, <u>a licensed dental assistant</u>, or <u>an expanded function</u>
 <u>dental assistant</u> under the supervision of <u>a licensed dentist</u>, of duties
 prescribed in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the
 department;

(9) The performance by a licensed dental hygienist or an expanded 21 function dental hygienist, by virtue of training and professional 22 ability, under the supervision of a licensed dentist, of taking dental 23 24 roentgenograms. Any other person is hereby authorized, under the supervision of a licensed dentist, to take dental roentgenograms but 25 shall not be authorized to do so until he or she has satisfactorily 26 completed a course in dental radiology recommended by the board and 27 28 approved by the department;

(10) Students of dentistry who practice dentistry upon patients in
 clinics in the regular course of instruction at an accredited school or
 college of dentistry;

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(11) Licensed physicians and surgeons who extract teeth or treat
 diseases of the oral cavity, gums, teeth, or maxillary bones as an
 incident to the general practice of their profession;-or

4 (12) Dental hygiene students who practice dental hygiene or expanded
5 <u>function dental hygiene</u> upon patients in clinics in the regular course of
6 instruction at an accredited dental hygiene program. Such dental hygiene

(1) Every applicant for a permit to practice expanded 15 Sec. 10. function dental hygiene shall (a) present proof of current, valid 16 17 licensure under the Dentistry Practice Act as a licensed dental hygienist at the time of application, (b) present proof of at least one thousand 18 19 five hundred hours of experience as a licensed dental hygienist, (c) present proof of successful completion of courses and examinations in 20 expanded function dental hygiene approved by the board, (d) pass a 21 22 jurisprudence examination approved by the board that is based on the 23 Nebraska statutes, rules, and regulations governing the practice of expanded function dental hygiene, and (e) complete continuing education 24 25 as a condition of the permit if required by the board.

(2) Upon completion of these requirements, the department, with the
 recommendation of the board, shall issue the applicant the applicable
 permit to practice expanded function dental hygiene.

 recommendation of the board, shall issue the applicant the applicable
 permit to practice as an expanded function dental assistant.

6 38-1130 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a licensed 7 dental hygienist shall perform the dental hygiene functions listed in 8 section 38-1131 only when authorized to do so by a licensed dentist who 9 shall be responsible for the total oral health care of the patient.

 writing prescriptions for mouth rinses and fluoride products that help

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1 (b) Authorization shall be granted by the department under this 2 subsection upon (i) filing an application with the department, (ii) providing evidence of current licensure and professional liability 3 insurance coverage, and (iii) providing evidence of three thousand hours 4 of clinical experience. Authorization may be limited by the department as 5 necessary to protect the public health and safety upon good cause shown 6 and may be renewed in connection with renewal of the licensed dental 7 8 hygienist's license.

9 (c) A licensed dental hygienist performing dental hygiene functions 10 as authorized under this subsection shall (i) report on a form developed 11 and provided by the department authorized functions performed by him or 12 her to the department and (ii) advise the patient or recipient of 13 services or his or her authorized representative that such services are 14 preventive in nature and do not constitute a comprehensive dental 15 diagnosis and care.

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Upon completion of education and testing approved by the board and when authorized by and under the general supervision of a licensed dentist, a licensed dental hygienist may write prescriptions for mouth rinses and fluoride products that help decrease the risk for tooth decay. 38-1132 (1)(a) A licensed dental hygienist may monitor nitrous oxide
analgesia under the indirect supervision of a licensed dentist.

9 (b) Upon completion of education and testing approved by the board,
10 a licensed dental hygienist may administer and titrate nitrous oxide
11 analgesia under the indirect supervision of a licensed dentist.

(2) A licensed dental hygienist may be approved by the department, 12 with the recommendation of the board, to administer local anesthesia 13 under the indirect supervision of a licensed dentist. The licensed dentist supervising a licensed 16 17 dental hygienist or an expanded function dental hygienist shall be responsible for patient care for each patient regardless of whether the 18 19 patient care is rendered personally by the dentist or by a licensed dental hygienist or an expanded function dental hygienist. 20

Sec. 22. An expanded function dental hygienist may perform all the procedures authorized for a licensed dental hygienist. Upon completion of education and testing approved by the board and with a permit from the department for the respective competency, an expanded function dental hygienist may, under the indirect supervision of a dentist, perform (1) restorative level one simple restorations and (2) restorative level two complex restorations.
