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1	SECTION 2. Section 61-31-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
2	Chapter 51, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
3	"61-31-4. LICENSE REQUIRED
4	A. Effective January 1, 1990, unless licensed to
5	practice social work under the Social Work Practice Act, no
6	person shall:
7	(1) practice as an independent social worker,
8	clinical social worker, master of social work or bachelor of
9	social work as defined in the Social Work Practice Act; or
10	(2) use the title or [represent himself as]
11	<u>make any representation as being</u> a licensed social worker <u>of</u>
12	any type or level or use any other title, abbreviation,
13	letters, figures, signs or devices that indicate the person is
14	licensed as a social worker.
15	B. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A
16	of this section, [any] <u>an</u> individual who is employed in an
17	executive agency on or after [the effective date of the Social
18	Work Practice Act] July 1, 1989 under the title of social
19	worker or other title [which] <u>that</u> is deemed to be social work
20	practice by the board and who has a bachelor's degree or higher
21	in a field other than social work shall not be required to be

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1	SECTION 3. Section 61-31-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
2	Chapter 51, Section 5) is amended to read:
3	"61-31-5. [EXEMPTIONS] USE OF TITLEOTHER PROFESSIONS
4	A. Except as otherwise provided in the Social Work
5	Practice Act, it is unlawful for an individual not licensed as
6	<u>a social worker to:</u>
7	(1) engage in the practice of social work;
8	(2) hold the individual out as a social worker
9	or claim to be a social worker or use the title of social
10	worker; or
11	(3) use any abbreviation or title that implies
12	or would lead the public to believe that the individual is a
13	social worker or is licensed to practice social work.
14	<u>B.</u> Nothing in the Social Work Practice Act shall be
15	construed to prevent qualified members of other recognized
16	professions that are licensed, certified or regulated under New
17	Mexico law or regulation from rendering services within the
18	scope of their license, certification or regulation; provided
19	that they do not represent themselves as licensed social
20	workers."
21	SECTION 4. Section 61-31-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
22	Chapter 51, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read:
23	"61-31-7. BOARD CREATED
24	A. There is created the "board of social work
25	examiners".
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B. The board shall be administratively attached to
 the department.

C. The board shall consist of seven members who are
representative of the geographic and ethnic groups within New
Mexico [who are United States citizens] and who have been New
Mexico residents [for at least five years] prior to their
appointment. Of the seven members:

8 (1)four members shall have been engaged in 9 social work practice for at least five years; at least two of the four shall hold a master's degree in social work; and at 10 least two shall hold a bachelor's degree in social work from 11 12 schools of social work that are accredited by the council on social work education. At least one of these members shall be 13 14 engaged primarily in clinical social work practice; one member shall be engaged primarily in education; one member shall be 15 engaged primarily in administration or research in social work 16 practice; and at least one member shall be engaged primarily in 17 community organization, planning and development. 18 These 19 members [shall not hold office in any professional organization 20 of social workers during their tenure on the board] may join professional organizations and associations organized 21 exclusively to promote the improvement of the practice of 22 social work for the protection of the health and welfare of the 23 public or whose activities assist and facilitate the work of 24 the board; and 25

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(2) three members shall represent the public. The public members shall not have been licensed or have practiced as social workers. Public members shall not have any significant financial interest, whether direct or indirect, in social work practice.

D. Members of the board shall be appointed by the governor for staggered terms of three years. Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as original appointments.

E. Except for the representatives of the public on the board, the governor shall appoint board members from a list of nominees submitted by social work organizations and individual social work professionals <u>or from a pool of resumes</u> <u>submitted to the governor by individuals applying for</u> membership.

F. Members of the board shall be reimbursed as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

G. The board shall elect a chair and other officers as deemed necessary to administer its duties.

H. A simple majority of the board members currently serving shall constitute a quorum of the board.

I. The board shall meet at least once a year and at such other times as it deems necessary. Other meetings may be

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1 called by the chair upon the written request of a quorum of the 2 board. The board may permit electronic participation in board meetings in accordance with the Open Meetings Act and board 3 4 rules. 5 J. The governor may remove any member from the board for: 6 7 (1) the neglect of any duty required by law; [for] (2) incompetence; 8 9 [for] (3) improper or unprofessional conduct as defined by board rule; 10 (4) violation of the current professional code 11 12 of ethics or professional standards promulgated by a national organization of social work professionals that provides 13 guidance, research, advocacy and other services to social 14 workers; or 15 [for] (5) any reason that would justify the 16 suspension or revocation of that member's license to practice 17 social work. 18 A board member shall not serve more than two 19 Κ. 20 consecutive terms, and any member failing to attend, after proper notice, three consecutive meetings shall automatically 21 be removed as a board member, unless excused for reasons set 22 forth in board [regulations] rules. 23 In the event of a vacancy for any reason, the L. 24 board secretary shall immediately notify the governor and the 25 .212720.2

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1 board of the vacancy and the reason for its occurrence to expedite the appointment of a new board member within a six-2 month period." 3 Section 61-31-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, 4 SECTION 5. 5 Chapter 51, Section 8, as amended) is amended to read: "61-31-8. BOARD'S AUTHORITY.--In addition to any 6 7 authority provided by law, the board shall have the authority 8 to: 9 Α. adopt and file, in accordance with the State 10 Rules Act, rules necessary to carry out the provisions of the Social Work Practice Act, in accordance with the provisions of 11 12 the Uniform Licensing Act, including the procedures for an 13 appeal of an examination failure; 14 Β. select, prepare and administer, at least annually, [written] examinations for licensure; 15 16 [C. adopt a professional code of ethics; 17 D.] C. appoint advisory committees pursuant to Section 61-31-19 NMSA 1978; 18 19 [E.] D. conduct hearings on an appeal of a denial 20 of a license based on the applicant's failure to meet the minimum qualifications for licensure. If the board's requests to an individual pursuant to this subsection are 13 unsuccessful or in a situation that the board deems to be an 14 emergency, the board may apply for an injunction in district 15 court to enjoin any person from committing any act prohibited 16 by the Social Work Practice Act; 17 H. develop criteria to approve appropriate 18 supervision for a person seeking licensure as a licensed 19 independent social worker or a licensed clinical social worker 20 based upon the prospective supervisor's: 21 (1) education; 22 (2) experience; and 23 (3) level of training; 24 issue provisional licenses, temporary licenses 25 I. .212720.2

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1 and licenses based on credentials to persons meeting the 2 requirements set forth in the Social Work Practice Act; 3 determine qualifications for licensure, J. 4 including the requirement to demonstrate an awareness and 5 knowledge of New Mexico cultures; set fees for licenses as authorized by the 6 к. 7 Social Work Practice Act and authorize all disbursements 8 necessary to carry out the provisions of the Social Work 9 Practice Act; [and] keep a record and provide notice of all 10 L. proceedings in accordance with the Open Meetings Act and shall 11 12 make an annual report to the governor; and M. determine the appropriate application of 13 technology to social work practice, including video 14 teleconferencing, for appropriate supervision and client 15 contact." 16 SECTION 6. 2 SECTION 7. Section 61-31-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 51, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read: 3 "61-31-11. PROVISIONAL LICENSURE. -- Prior to examination, 4 5 an applicant for licensure who holds a bachelor's degree or master's degree in social work may obtain a provisional license 6 7 to engage in social work practice as long as the applicant 8 meets all the requirements, except examination, [as prescribed 9 in Section 61-31-10 NMSA 1978] pursuant to the Social Work Practice Act for the level of license sought. The provisional 10 license is valid for a period not to exceed one year." 11 12 SECTION 8. Section 61-31-14 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, 13 Chapter 51, Section 14, as amended) is amended to read: 14 "61-31-14. LICENSE RENEWAL.--Each licensee shall renew the licensee's license 15 Α. biennially by submitting a renewal application on a form 16 17 provided by the board. At the time of license renewal, the 18 board shall require a licensee to produce evidence of 19

continuing education, as prescribed by the board. The board may establish a method to provide for staggered biennial terms of licensure. The board may authorize license renewal for one year to establish the renewal cycle.

B. A thirty-day grace period shall be allowed each licensee after each annual licensing period, during which time licenses may be renewed upon payment of the renewal fee and

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1 providing evidence of continuing education as prescribed by the 2 board.

Any licensee who allows the licensee's license C. to lapse for longer than three months shall have the license automatically revoked and may be required to take [a written] an examination.

D. A late penalty fee shall be assessed after the thirty-day grace period has expired for anyone attempting to 8 9 renew a license to practice social work."

Β. for initial licensure following [a written] an examination as a [baccalaureate] licensed bachelor of social [worker] work, two hundred dollars (\$200);

C. for initial licensure following [a written] an examination as a licensed master of social [worker] work, three hundred dollars (\$300);

D. for initial licensure following [a written] an examination as [an] a licensed independent social worker, three hundred dollars (\$300);

> C. is trained in New Mexico cultures;

D. passed a jurisprudence examination; and

passed an examination approved by the board, Ε. including a master's examination administered by a nonprofit association composed of and owned by social work regulatory boards and colleges in all states."

> is at least eighteen years of age; Α.

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1 Β. possesses at least a bachelor's degree in social 2 work from a graduate program of social work accredited by a 3 recognized association; is trained in New Mexico cultures; C. 4 5 D. passed a jurisprudence examination; and Ε. passed an examination approved by the board, 6 7 including a bachelor's examination administered by a nonprofit association composed of and owned by social work regulatory 8 9 boards and colleges in all states." SECTION 15. A new section of the Social Work Practice Act 10 11 is enacted to read: 12 "[NEW MATERIAL] APPROPRIATE SUPERVISION--GUIDELINES.--An individual providing appropriate supervision as defined in 13 14 Section 61-31-3 NMSA 1978 shall conform to supervision guidelines that the board establishes by rule." 15 SECTION 16.
