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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
19	SECTION 1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONAFFORDABLE HOUSING
20	STUDY
21	A. By January 1, 2020, the city of Albuquerque
22	shall contract with a person that has no ties to any affordable
23	housing income stream to conduct an independent study to
24	contribute to a framework for ending homelessness. The study
25	shall address all types of affordable rental housing for
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1 individuals whose income is thirty percent or below of area 2 median income in the city of Albuquerque, including permanent supportive housing vouchers, rental assistance, vouchers issued 3 pursuant to Section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937, 4 public housing and low-income housing tax credit rentals. 5 The study findings shall include: 6 Β. 7 (1)the number of affordable housing units; (2) any funding needed to bridge any gaps 8 9 found for each type of affordable rental housing; a determination of the overall unmet need; 10 (3) a determination of the effect of any unmet (4) 11 12 needs for affordable housing on the demand for emergency shelter; 13 a geospatial analysis of affordable 14 (5) housing stock within the city of Albuquerque; 15 an evaluation of the feasibility and cost 16 (6) for the New Mexico mortgage finance authority to consider 17 conducting a similar statewide study of affordable housing 18 19 resources to determine unmet housing needs throughout New 20 Mexico; input from relevant stakeholders, (7) 21 including the city of Albuquerque, the children, youth and 22 families department, the human services department, the New 23 Mexico mortgage finance authority, a nonprofit coalition of 24 nonprofit agencies that provide housing and services to 25 .213068.3 - 2 -

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1 individuals and families experiencing homelessness in New 2 Mexico, and Albuquerque homeless services providers; (8) a list of current state agency rules and 3 legislation that inhibit the availability of affordable housing 4 for individuals whose income is thirty percent or below of area 5 median income for the city of Albuquerque and proposed 6 7 legislative solutions to address those issues; and (9) recommendations for pre-development 8 9 activities, including services associated with land acquisition, planning and design, as directed by the city of 10 Albuquerque. 11 C. 12 By November 1, 2020, the city of Albuquerque shall provide the study findings and recommendations to the 13 14 appropriate legislative body. D. For the purposes of this section: 15 "area median income" means the midpoint of (1)16 the city of Albuquerque's income distribution adjusted for 17 family size published annually by the United States department 18 of housing and urban development; and 19 20 (2)"geospatial analysis" means using geographic information systems to create maps that visualize 21 data related to affordable housing resources. 22 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred fifty thousand 23 dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the 24 local government division of the department of finance and 25 .213068.3 - 3 -
