# AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIME; CREATING THE CRIME OF ORGANIZED RESIDENTIAL THEFT; PRESCRIBING PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted to read:

## "[NEW MATERIAL] ORGANIZED RESIDENTIAL THEFT.--

- Organized residential theft consists of acting in concert with one or more persons for the purpose of stealing personal property from more than one residence or from a single residence on two or more occasions.
- Whoever commits organized residential theft is guilty of:
- (1) a fourth degree felony when the total retail value of the personal property stolen within a three-.226653.2

hundred-sixty-five-day period is more than five hundred dollars (\$500) but not more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500);

- a third degree felony when the total (2) retail value of the personal property stolen within a threehundred-sixty-five-day period is more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) but not more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000); and
- a second degree felony when the total (3) retail value of the personal property stolen within a threehundred-sixty-five-day period is more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000).
- C. A person charged with committing organized residential theft shall not be charged with a separate or additional offense arising from the same action or occurrence.

#### As used in this section: D.

- "personal property" means chattels of any type or description, including letters, packages or parcels distributed by mail or other methods of delivery; and
- "residence" includes a dwelling, the (2) curtilage of a dwelling and shared spaces in a multifamily dwelling."
