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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:			
8	SECTION 1. Section 66-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990,			
9	Chapter 120, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:			
10	"66-1-4.3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Motor Vehicle			
11	Code:			
12	A. "camping body" means a vehicle body primarily			
13	designed or converted for use as temporary living quarters			
14	for recreational, camping or travel activities excluding			
15	recreational vehicles unless used in commerce;			
16	B. "camping trailer" means a camping body, mounted			
17	on a chassis, or frame with wheels, designed to be drawn by			
18	another vehicle and that has collapsible partial side walls			
19	that fold for towing and unfold at the campsite;			
20	C. "cancellation" means that a driver's license is			
21	annulled and terminated because of some error or defect or			
22	because the licensee is no longer entitled to the license,			
23	but cancellation of a license is without prejudice, and			
24	application for a new license may be made at any time after			
25	cancellation;			

D. "casual sale" means the sale of a motor vehicle by the registered owner of the vehicle if the owner has not sold more than four vehicles in that calendar year;

E. "chassis" means the complete motor vehicle, including standard factory equipment, exclusive of the body and cab;

F. "collector" means a person who is the owner of one or more vehicles of historic or special interest who collects, purchases, acquires, trades or disposes of these vehicles or parts thereof for the person's own use in order to preserve, restore and maintain a similar vehicle for hobby purposes;

13 G. "combination" means any connected assemblage of 14 a motor vehicle and one or more semitrailers, trailers or 15 semitrailers converted to trailers by means of a converter 16 gear;

H. "combination gross vehicle weight" means the
sum total of the gross vehicle weights of all units of a
combination;

I. "commerce" means the transportation of persons, property or merchandise for hire, compensation, profit or in the furtherance of a commercial enterprise in this state or between New Mexico and a place outside New Mexico, including a place outside the United States;

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J. "commercial motor vehicle" means a

self-propelled or towed vehicle, other than special mobile equipment, used on public highways in commerce to transport passengers or property when the vehicle:

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4 is operated interstate and has a gross (1)vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating, or 5 6 gross vehicle weight or gross combination weight, of four thousand five hundred thirty-six kilograms, or ten thousand 7 one pounds or more; or is operated only in intrastate 8 commerce and has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross 9 10 combination weight rating, or gross vehicle weight or gross combination weight, of twenty-six thousand one or more 11 pounds; 12

13 (2) is designed or used to transport more
14 than eight passengers, including the driver, and is used to
15 transport passengers for compensation;

16 (3) is designed or used to transport sixteen 17 or more passengers, including the driver, and is not used to 18 transport passengers for compensation; or

19 (4) is used to transport hazardous materials
20 of the type or quantity requiring placarding under rules
21 prescribed by applicable federal or state law;

K. "controlled-access highway" means every highway, street or roadway in respect to which owners or occupants of abutting lands and other persons have no legal right of access to or from the highway, street or roadway

except at those points only and in the manner as may be
 determined by the public authority having jurisdiction over
 the highway, street or roadway;

L. "controlled substance" means any substance defined in Section 30-31-2 NMSA 1978 as a controlled substance;

"converter gear" means any assemblage of one or 7 М. 8 more axles with a fifth wheel mounted thereon, designed for 9 use in a combination to support the front end of a semitrailer but not permanently attached thereto. A 10 converter gear shall not be considered a vehicle, as that 11 term is defined in Section 66-1-4.19 NMSA 1978, but weight 12 attributable thereto shall be included in declared gross 13 weight; 14

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N. "conviction":

(1) means:

17 (a) a finding of guilt in the trial
18 court in regard to which the violator has waived or exhausted
19 all rights to appeal;

20 (b) a plea of guilty or nolo contendere 21 accepted by the court;

(c) an unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to secure a person's appearance in court; or

1 penalty assessment; and 2 does not include a conditional discharge (2) 3 as provided in Section 31-20-13 NMSA 1978 or a deferred sentence when the terms of the deferred sentence are met; 4 5 0. "credential holder" means a person who has been issued a physical or an electronic credential; 6 Ρ. "crosswalk" means: 7 (1) that part of a roadway at an 8 intersection included within the connections of the lateral 9 10 lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the 11 edges of the traversable roadway; and 12 any portion of a roadway at an 13 (2) intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian 14 15 crossing by lines or other markings on the surface; and Q. "curb cut" means a short ramp through a curb or 16 built up to the curb." 17 SECTION 2. Section 66-1-4.4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990, 18 Chapter 120, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read: 19 "66-1-4.4. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Motor Vehicle 20 Code: 21 Α. "data element" means a distinct component of a 22 customer's information that is found on the department's 23 customer record; 24 B. "day" means calendar day, unless otherwise 25

1 provided in the Motor Vehicle Code;

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C. "dealer", except as specifically excluded, means any person who sells or solicits or advertises the sale of new or used motor vehicles, manufactured homes or trailers subject to registration in this state; "dealer" does not include:

7 (1) receivers, trustees, administrators,
8 executors, guardians or other persons appointed by or acting
9 under judgment, decree or order of any court;

10 (2) public officers while performing their 11 duties as such officers;

12 (3) persons making casual sales of their own 13 vehicles;

14 (4) finance companies, banks and other15 lending institutions making sales of repossessed vehicles; or

16 (5) licensed brokers under the Manufactured
17 Housing Act who, for a fee, commission or other valuable
18 consideration, engage in brokerage activities related to the
19 sale, exchange or lease purchase of pre-owned manufactured
20 homes on a site installed for a consumer;

D. "declared gross weight" means the maximum gross vehicle weight or gross combination vehicle weight at which a vehicle or combination will be operated during the registration period, as declared by the registrant for registration and fee purposes; the vehicle or combination

shall have only one declared gross weight for all operating considerations;

E. "department" means the taxation and revenue department, the secretary of taxation and revenue or any employee of the department exercising authority lawfully delegated to that employee by the secretary;

"designated accessible parking space for 7 F. 8 persons with significant mobility limitation" means any space, including an access aisle, that is marked and reserved 9 10 for the parking of a passenger vehicle that carries registration plates or a parking placard with the 11 international symbol of access issued in accordance with 12 Section 66-3-16 NMSA 1978 and that is designated by a 13 conspicuously posted sign bearing the international symbol of 14 15 access and, if the parking space is paved, by a clearly visible depiction of this symbol painted in blue on the 16 pavement of the space; 17

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G. "director" means the secretary;

H. "disqualification" means a prohibition against driving a commercial motor vehicle;

I. "distinguishing number" means the number assigned by the department to a vehicle whose identifying number has been destroyed or obliterated or the number assigned by the department to a vehicle that has never had an identifying number;

J. "distributor" means a person who distributes or sells new or used motor vehicles to dealers and who is not a manufacturer;

K. "division", without further specification, "division of motor vehicles" or "motor vehicle division" means the department;

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7 L. "driveaway-towaway operation" means an 8 operation in which any motor vehicle, new or used, is the 9 item being transported when one set or more of wheels of any 10 such motor vehicle is on the roadway during the course of 11 transportation, whether or not the motor vehicle furnishes 12 the motive power;

M. "driver" means every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle, including a motorcycle, upon a highway, who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being towed by a motor vehicle or who operates or is in actual physical control of an off-highway motor vehicle;

N. "driver-assisted platoon" means a series ofmotor vehicles platooning with a driver in each vehicle;

0. "driver's license" means any license, permit or
 driving authorization card issued by a state or other
 jurisdiction recognized under the laws of New Mexico
 pertaining to the authorizing of persons to operate motor
 vehicles and includes a REAL ID-compliant driver's license

and a standard driver's license; and

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P. "dynamic driving task" means all of the real-time operational and tactical functions required to operate a vehicle in on-road traffic, excluding the strategic functions such as trip scheduling and selection of destinations and waypoints."

SECTION 3. Section 66-1-4.5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990, Chapter 120, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:

9 "66-1-4.5. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Motor Vehicle 10 Code:

A. "electric-assisted bicycle" means a vehicle
having two or three wheels, fully operable pedals and an
electric motor. Electric-assisted bicycles are classified as
follows:

(1) "class l electric-assisted bicycle"
means an electric-assisted bicycle equipped with a motor not
exceeding seven hundred fifty watts of power that provides
assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to
provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of twenty
miles per hour;

(2) "class 2 electric-assisted bicycle"
means an electric-assisted bicycle equipped with a motor not
exceeding seven hundred fifty watts of power that provides
assistance regardless of whether the rider is pedaling but
ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed

of twenty miles per hour; and

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(3) "class 3 electric-assisted bicycle" means an electric-assisted bicycle equipped with a motor not exceeding seven hundred fifty watts of power that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of twenty-eight miles per hour;

B. "electric mobility device" means a two- or
three-wheel vehicle with an electric motor for propulsion
that does not meet the definition of an electric-assisted
bicycle and is capable of exceeding a speed of twenty miles
per hour on motor power alone;

C. "electric personal assistive mobility device" 13 means a self-balancing device having two nontandem wheels 14 15 designed to transport a single person by means of an electric 16 propulsion system with an average power of one horsepower and with a maximum speed on a paved level surface of less than 17 twenty miles per hour when powered solely by its propulsion 18 system and while being ridden by an operator who weighs one 19 20 hundred seventy pounds;

D. "electronic credential" means an electronic
extension of the department-issued physical credential that
conveys identity and driving privilege information;

24 E. "electronic credential system" means a digital25 process that includes a method for loading electronic

1 credentials onto a device, issuing electronic credentials, 2 requesting and transmitting electronic credential data 3 elements and performing tasks to maintain the system; 4 "essential parts" means all integral and body F. parts of a vehicle of a type required to be registered by the 5 provisions of the Motor Vehicle Code, the removal, alteration 6 or substitution of which would tend to conceal the identity 7 of the vehicle or substantially alter its appearance, model, 8 type or mode of operation; 9 10 G. "established place of business", for a dealer or auto recycler, means a place: 11 devoted exclusively to the business for 12 (1)which the dealer or auto recycler is licensed and related 13 business; 14 15 (2) identified by a prominently displayed 16 sign giving the dealer's or auto recycler's trade name used by the business; 17 of sufficient size or space to permit (3) 18 the display of one or more vehicles or to permit the parking 19 20 or storing of vehicles to be dismantled or wrecked for recycling; 21 (4) on which there is located an enclosed 22 building on a permanent foundation, which building meets the 23 building requirements of the community and is large enough to 24 accommodate the office or offices of the dealer or auto 25

recycler and large enough to provide a safe place to keep the books and records of the dealer or auto recycler;

(5) where the principal portion of the business of the dealer or auto recycler is conducted and where the books and records of the business are kept and maintained; and

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where vehicle sales are of new vehicles 7 (6) 8 only, such as a department store or a franchisee of a department store, as long as the department store or 9 10 franchisee keeps the books and records of its vehicle business in a general office location at its place of 11 business; as used in this paragraph, "department store" means 12 a business that offers a variety of merchandise other than 13 vehicles, and sales of the merchandise other than vehicles 14 15 constitute at least eighty percent of the gross sales of the business; and 16

"explosives" means any chemical compound or H. 17 mechanical mixture that is commonly used or intended for the 18 purpose of producing an explosion and that contains any 19 20 oxidizing and combustive units or other ingredients in such proportions, quantities or packing that an ignition by fire, 21 friction, concussion, percussion or detonator of any part of 22 the compound or mixture may cause such a sudden generation of 23 highly heated gases that the resultant gaseous pressures are 24 capable of producing destructive effects on contiguous 25

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objects or of destroying life or limb."

SECTION 4. Section 66-1-4.15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990, Chapter 120, Section 16, as amended) is amended to read:

"66-1-4.15. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Motor Vehicle Code:

7 A. "railroad" means a carrier of persons or
8 property upon cars operated upon stationary rails;

B. "railroad sign or signal" means any sign,
signal or device erected by authority of a public body or
official or by a railroad and intended to give notice of the
presence of railroad tracks or the approach of a railroad
train;

C. "railroad train" means a steam engine, electric
or other motor, with or without cars coupled thereto,
operated upon rails;

D. "REAL ID-compliant driver's license" means a license or a class of license issued by a state or other jurisdiction pertaining to the authorizing of persons to operate motor vehicles and that meets federal requirements to be accepted by federal agencies for official federal purposes;

E. "REAL ID-compliant identification card" means
an identification card that meets federal requirements to be
accepted by federal agencies for official federal purposes;

F. "reconstructed vehicle" means any vehicle assembled or constructed largely by means of essential parts, new or used, derived from other vehicles or that, if originally otherwise assembled or constructed, has been materially altered by the removal of essential parts, new or used;

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7 G. "recreational travel trailer" means a camping8 body designed to be drawn by another vehicle;

9 H. "recreational vehicle" means a vehicle with a 10 camping body that has its own motive power, is affixed to or 11 is drawn by another vehicle and includes motor homes, travel 12 trailers and truck campers;

I. "registration" means registration certificates
and registration plates issued under the laws of New Mexico
pertaining to the registration of vehicles;

J. "registration number" means the number assigned upon registration by the division to the owner of a vehicle or motor vehicle required to be registered by the Motor Vehicle Code;

20 K. "registration plate" means the plate, marker,
21 sticker or tag assigned by the division for the
22 identification of the registered vehicle;

L. "relying party" means an entity to which acredential holder is presenting an electronic credential;

M. "residence district" means the territory

contiguous to and including a highway not comprising a business district when the property on the highway for a distance of three hundred feet or more is in the main improved with residences or residences and buildings in use for business;

N. "revocation" means that the driver's license and privilege to drive a motor vehicle on the public highways are terminated and shall not be renewed or restored, except that an application for a new license may be presented to and acted upon by the division after the expiration of at least one year after date of revocation;

12 0. "right of way" means the privilege of the 13 immediate use of the roadway;

P. "road tractor" means every motor vehicle designed and used primarily for drawing other vehicles and constructed not to carry a significant load on the road tractor, either independently or as any part of the weight of a vehicle or load drawn; and

Q. "roadway" means that portion of a street or highway improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder; when a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" refers to each roadway separately but not to all of the roadways collectively."

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SECTION 5. Section 66-1-4.19 NMSA 1978 (being Laws

1990, Chapter 120, Section 20, as amended) is amended to 2 read:

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"66-1-4.19. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Motor Vehicle Code:

"validating sticker" means the tab or sticker Α. issued by the division to signify, upon a registration plate, renewed registration;

Β. "vehicle" means every device in, upon or by 8 which any person or property is or may be transported or 9 drawn upon a highway, including any frame, chassis, body or 10 unitized frame and body of any vehicle or motor vehicle, 11 except devices moved exclusively by human power or used 12 exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks; 13

C. "vehicle-business number" means the distinctive 14 15 registration number given by the division to any 16 manufacturer, auto recycler or dealer;

"vehicle plate" means a plate, marker, sticker D. or tag similar to a registration plate, but that is issued by the department for vehicles that are exempted from registration under the Motor Vehicle Code; and

"verification process" means a method of Ε. 21 authenticating an electronic credential through the use of 22 secure and encrypted communication." 23

SECTION 6. Section 66-5-16 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, 24 Chapter 35, Section 238, as amended) is amended to read: 25

11	agreements with an agency of the state, another state or the	
12	United States to facilitate the issuance, use and	
13	verification process of electronic credentials issued by the	
14	department or another state."	
15	SECTION 10. A new Section 66-5-604 NMSA 1978 is enacted	
16	to read:	
17	"66-5-604. PHYSICAL POSSESSION OF DEVICEThe	
18	department shall design the electronic credential in a manner	
19	that allows the credential holder to maintain physical	
20	possession of the device on which the electronic credential	
21	is accessed during verification."	
22	SECTION 11. A new Section 66-5-605 NMSA 1978 is enacted	
23	to read:	
24	"66-5-605. CONSENT TO ACCESSAccess to the credential	
25	holder's data by a relying party shall require the credential	STBTC/SB 88 Page 18

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holder's consent."

SECTION 12. A new Section 66-5-606 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"66-5-606. ADMINISTRATION OF ELECTRONIC CREDENTIAL SYSTEM.--A third party may administer on behalf of the department a system developed to facilitate the issuance, verification and use of electronic credentials."

8 SECTION 13. A new Section 66-5-607 NMSA 1978 is enacted 9 to read:

"66-5-607. FEE.--The department may charge a fee for the loading of an electronic credential onto a device."

SECTION 14. A new Section 66-5-608 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"66-5-608. RULES.--The department may promulgate rules that it deems necessary or appropriate to implement the provisions of the Electronic Credentials Act."\_\_\_\_\_\_
