SUMMARY—Revises workforce provisions relating to development. (BDR 34-315)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets for its material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to workforce development; requiring the board of trustees of a school district or the governing body of a charter school to implement a policy to promote workbased learning programs and programs to prepare for apprenticeships; authorizing the board of trustees or the governing body to work with certain governmental and nongovernmental entities in developing and implementing the policy; authorizing the board of trustees and governing body to accept gifts, grants and donations and other forms of money to implement the policy; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes the board of trustees of a school district or the 23456789 governing body of a charter school to offer a work-based learning program with the approval of the State Board of Education. Pupils who complete a work-based learning program are allowed to apply the credits earned through such a program toward the total number of elective credits required for graduation from high school. (NRS 389.167) Section 2 of this bill requires the board of trustees of a school district or the governing body of a charter school to develop and implement a policy to promote work-based learning programs and programs to prepare pupils for an apprenticeship. Section 2 requires such a policy to include a process to notify 10 parents and pupils of such programs. Section 2 also authorizes a board of trustees 11 or governing body to consult with certain governmental entities and other trade, 12 economic development and business and industry-based organizations in 13 developing and implementing a policy to identify and promote work-based learning 14 programs and programs to prepare pupils for apprenticeships.

15 Section 3 of this bill authorizes the board of trustees of a school district or the 16 governing body of a charter school to accept gifts, grants and donations or other





17 sources of money to aid in the implementation of such policies, to be separately 18 accounted for by the board of trustees or governing body, as applicable.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 389 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

3 1. The board of trustees of a school district or the Sec. 2. 4 governing body of a charter school shall develop and implement a 5 policy to promote work-based learning programs approved 6 pursuant to NRS 389.167 and programs to prepare pupils for 7 apprenticeships. The policy must include, without limitation, a process by which to notify pupils and the parents or guardians of 8 9 pupils of work-based learning programs and programs to prepare 10 pupils for apprenticeships.

In developing and implementing a policy pursuant to 11 2. subsection 1, the board of trustees of a school district or the 12 governing body of a charter school, as applicable, may consult 13 14 with other governmental entities or organizations, including, without limitation, the Department, the Nevada System of Higher 15 Education, the Office of Workforce Innovation, the State Apprenticeship Council, the Department of Motor Vehicles, the 16 17 Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation and 18 19 other trade, economic development and business and industrybased organizations to identify and promote work-based learning 20 21 programs and programs to prepare pupils for apprenticeships.

Sec. 3. 1. The board of trustees of a school district may 22 23 apply for and accept gifts, grants and donations or other sources 24 of money to aid in the implementation of a policy to promote work-25 based learning programs and programs to prepare pupils for 26 apprenticeships pursuant to section 2 of this act to be deposited in a separate account established and administered by the board of 27 28 trustees of the school district under the provisions of NRS 354.603. 29 The governing body of a charter school may apply for and 2. accept gifts, grants and donations or other sources of money to aid 30 31 in the implementation of a policy to promote work-based learning programs and programs to prepare pupils for apprenticeships 32 pursuant to section 2 of this act and shall separately account for 33
