SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing public nuisances. (BDR 15-53)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public nuisances; making it a public nuisance for a person to engage in certain activities relating to highways, roads, state lands or other public lands or lands dedicated to public use; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law states that: (1) a public nuisance is a crime against the order and 234567 economy of the State; and (2) a person commits a public nuisance if he or she engages in various activities, including without limitation, unlawfully interfering with or obstructing a street, bridge or highway. (NRS 202.450) A person who commits or maintains a public nuisance for which no special punishment is prescribed is guilty of a misdemeanor, and a court may order the person to abate the nuisance and pay a civil penalty of not less than \$500 but not more than \$5,000. (NRS 202.470, 202.480) Section 3.2 of this bill expands existing law by making it 8 9 a public nuisance for a person, by force, threat, intimidation or any other unlawful 10 means, to prevent or obstruct the free passage or transit over or through certain 11 highways, roads, state lands or other public lands or lands dedicated to public use 12 or to knowingly misrepresent the status of or assert any right to the exclusive use 13 and occupancy of those highways, roads, state lands or other public lands or lands 14 dedicated to public use, if the person has no leasehold interest in or claim or color 15 of title to the highway, road, state land or other public land or land dedicated to 16 public use. Sections 3.4-3.8 of this bill make conforming changes.

1 involving the controlled substance, immediate precursor or 2 controlled substance analog have been removed from or remediated 3 on the building or place by an entity certified or licensed to do so; or

4 (b) The owner of the building or place fails to have all materials 5 or substances involving the controlled substance, immediate 6 precursor or controlled substance analog removed from or 7 remediated on the building or place by an entity certified or licensed 8 to do so within 180 days after the building or place is no longer used 9 for the purpose of unlawfully manufacturing a controlled substance, 10 immediate precursor or controlled substance analog.

5. It is a public nuisance for any person:

(a) By force, threat or intimidation, or by fencing or otherwise
enclosing, or by any other unlawful means, to prevent or obstruct
the free passage or transit over or through any:

(1) Highway designated as a United States highway;

16 (2) Highway designated as a state highway pursuant to 17 NRS 408.285;

18 (3) Main or general county road designated pursuant to 19 NRS 403.170;

20 21 (4) State land or other public land; or

(5) Land dedicated to public use; or

(b) To knowingly misrepresent the status of or assert any right
to the exclusive use and occupancy of such a highway, road, state
land or other public land or land dedicated to public use,

25 → if the person has no leasehold interest, claim or color of title,
26 made or asserted in good faith, in or to the highway, road, state
27 land or other public land or land dedicated to public use.

6. Agricultural activity conducted on farmland consistent with good agricultural practice and established before surrounding nonagricultural activities is not a public nuisance unless it has a substantial adverse effect on the public health or safety. It is presumed that an agricultural activity which does not violate a federal, state or local law, ordinance or regulation constitutes good agricultural practice.

A shooting range is not a public nuisance with respect to
any noise attributable to the shooting range if the shooting range is
in compliance with the provisions of all applicable statutes,
ordinances and regulations concerning noise:

(a) As those provisions existed on October 1, 1997, for a
shooting range that begins operation on or before October 1, 1997;
or

42 (b) As those provisions exist on the date that the shooting range
43 begins operation, for a shooting range in operation after October 1,

1  $\rightarrow$  A shooting range is not subject to any state or local law related to 2 the control of noise that is adopted or amended after the date set 3 forth in paragraph (a) or (b), as applicable, and does not constitute a 4 nuisance for failure to comply with any such law. 5 **7.** 8. A request for emergency assistance by a tenant as 6 described in NRS 118A.515 and 118B.152 is not a public nuisance. 7 **[8.] 9.** As used in this section: 8 (a) "Board of health" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 439.4797. 9

6 268.412 Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3 of NRS 7 40.140 and subsection [6] 7 of NRS 202.450, the city council or 8 other governing body of a city may, by ordinance regularly enacted, 9 regulate, control and prohibit, as a public nuisance, excessive noise 10 which is injurious to health or which interferes unreasonably with 11 the comfortable enjoyment of life or property within the boundaries 12 of the city.
