BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) There is hereby created the Ohio Children's	3
Behavioral Health Prevention Network Stakeholder Group. The	4
purpose of the Stakeholder Group shall be to coordinate and plan	5
the creation of a comprehensive learning network to support	6
young children and their families in facilitating social,	7
emotional, and behavioral development and to seek to reduce	8
behavioral health disparities among young children.	9
(B) The Stakeholder Group shall consist of the following	10
members:	11

(1) The Director of the Governor's Children's Initiatives 12

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created pursuant to Executive Order 2019-02D;	
(2) The Director of Health, or the Director's designee;	14
(3) The Director of Mental Health and Addiction Services,	15
or the Director's designee;	16
(4) The Medicaid Director, or the Director's designee;	17
(5) The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or the	18
Superintendent's designee;	19
(6) The Executive Director of the Governor's Office of	20
Faith-Based and Community Initiatives, or the Executive	21
Director's designee;	22
(7) The Executive Director of the Commission on Minority	23
Health, or the Executive Director's designee;	24
(8) Members selected by the Director of the Governor's	25
Children's Initiatives, including at least one member who is a	26
parent of a child with mental illness and one or more members	27
from each of the following:	28
(a) The Ohio Children's Hospital Association;	29
(b) The Ohio Chapter of the American Academy of	30
Pediatrics;	31
(c) The Ohio Children's Alliance;	32
(d) The National Alliance on Mental Illness of Ohio;	33

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(h) Primary and secondary schools.

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(C) The Director of the Governor's Children's Initiatives 39 shall select the members identified in division (B)(8) of this 40 section not later than 30 days after the effective date of this 41 section. Not later than 30 days after the Director selects the 42 members, the Director shall convene the initial meeting of the 43 Stakeholder Group. The Stakeholder Group shall continue to meet 44 at the call of the Director during the eighteen months 45 immediately following the date of the initial meeting. 46

(D) The Director of Children's Initiatives shall determine
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the scope, implementation, and details of the Stakeholder
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Group's work and shall coordinate the efforts of the members.
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Under the leadership of the Director, the Stakeholder Group
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shall do all of the following:

(1) Establish governance and steering teams related to the learning network described in division (A) of this section;

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(2) Develop common aims and goals of the StakeholderGroup; 55
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(3) Establish a list of agencies and partners to
participate in a prevention pilot program of the learning
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network;

(4) Develop prevention prototypes to be tested by
prevention pilot program participants, including prototypes that
are culturally and linguistically appropriate;
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(5) Establish a peer leader group to lead in the
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identification of key resources and key partners for early
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testing;
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(6) Conduct a baseline assessment of existing protocols 65

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and best practices related to achieving the purpose identified	
in division (A) of this section;	67
(7) Review current data systems and behavioral health	68
prevention funding mechanisms;	69
(8) Collect aggregate data, with a focus on outcome based	70
data;	71
(9) Collect disaggregated data, with a focus on race,	72
ethnicity, parental income and education, and type of health	73
insurance.	74
(E) The Director of the Governor's Children's Initiatives	75
shall collaborate with the Departments of Health, Mental Health	76
and Addiction Services, Medicaid, and Education regarding any	
funds necessary to complete the Stakeholder Group's work. Any	78
allocations of funds shall be determined by those departments.	79
(F) At the conclusion of the eighteen months described in	80
division (C) of this section, the Director of the Governor's	81
Children's Initiatives shall complete a report that includes the	82
Stakeholder Group's recommendations. The report shall be	83
submitted to the Governor and, in accordance with section 101.68	84
of the Revised Code, the General Assembly.	85
