BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

| Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.53 of the | 4 |

| (B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the | 12 |
| registrar collects in the fund as follows: | 13 |
| The registrar shall pay the contributions received | 14 |
| pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast | 15 |

cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who have45

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pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar56receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to57special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions58for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74

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receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78 America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for scholarships for students who are members of that organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio100aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to101facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational102programming.103

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The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the105organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that106organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in107need.108

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116 section. A university or college that receives contributions 117 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118 scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar129receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to130Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes131of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who132attend the university. The university shall not use any of the133

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funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship134program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements135with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such136funds as provided in this section.137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147 receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 148 Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 149 contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151 receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 152 equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 153 Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 154 advocates for addiction recovery). 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 157 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 158 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 159 cyclists of all ages. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar161receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the162

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"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 163 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 164 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 165 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 166 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar168receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the169fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for170the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the171lighthouses of fairport harbor.172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar173receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the174Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the175contributions only to promote and support the football team of176Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 179 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 180 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 181 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 182 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 183 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 184 sponsors within this state. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 187 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 188 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 189 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 190 activities. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 192 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 193 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 194 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 195 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 196 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 199 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 200 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 201 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 202 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 203 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 204 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 205 the improvement of patient outcomes. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The council shall use the money it receives to assist its members who are experiencing financial hardship.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 213 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 214 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 215 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 216 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 217 personnel, veterans, and their families. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar219receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the220Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for221

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the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 223 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 224 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 225 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 226 further the nonprofit's mission. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 228 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 229 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 230 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 231 families. 232

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the246contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section2474503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other248source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is249designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The250

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Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this251section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and252cats and for educational programs concerning the proper253veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio254pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and255maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar257receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the258rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.259

260 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 261 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 262 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 263 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 264 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 265 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 266 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 267 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 268 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 269 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 270 271 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received under this section. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar278receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the279western reserve historical society, which shall use the280

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 282 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 283 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 284 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 285 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 286

contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 287 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 288 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 289 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 290 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 291 the person who paid the contribution resides. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 293 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 294 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 295 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 296 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 297 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 298 entertainment, business, and residential living. 299

300 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 301 302 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 303 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 304 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 305 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 306 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 307 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 308 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 309 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 310

such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 318 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 319 nature preserve. 320

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar325receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the326Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the327contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar329receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the330girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the331contributions to support the activities of the organization.332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333 receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 334 Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 335 the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 336 rehabilitation, and educational programs. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar338receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the339

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Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those340contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational341information about beekeeping, and to support other state and342local beekeeping programs.343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 345 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 346 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 347 legends to inspire future leaders. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 350 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 351 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 352 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 353 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 354 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 357 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 358 the contributions for educational purposes. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar360receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the361Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the362contributions to support the activities of the organization.363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 365 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 366 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 367 center. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar369receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the370American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the371contributions to support the activities of the organization.372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373 receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 374 Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund 375 scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 376 natural gas industry. 377

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 378 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 379 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 380 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 381 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 382 383 commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 384 of the county of residence of an applicant. 385

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 386 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 387 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 388 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 389 participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 390 (G) of that section. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 393 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 394 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 395 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 396 Ohio and for educational programs. 397 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 399 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 400 supporting cancer research. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar405receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the406Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar408receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the409Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the410contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville411pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event.412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar413receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the414Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council415shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner416throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 418 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 419 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 420 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 421 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 422 scouts. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar424receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the425Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council426

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shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner427throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar429receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the430charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m.,431which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar433receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the434Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,435which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 438 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 439 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 440 charitable purposes. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar442receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the443Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.444

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 445 receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 446 Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 447 of Dayton. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar449receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the450fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall451deposit the fees into its general account to be used for452purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar454receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the455

fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall456deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be457used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law458enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement459methods, and teaching respect for law and order.460

The registrar shall pay the contributions received461pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio462concerns of police survivors, which shall use those463contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate464to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed465in the line of duty.466

The registrar shall pay the contributions received467pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater468Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those469contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in470the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.471

The registrar shall pay the contributions received472pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio473association of chiefs of police.474

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 475 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 476 Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 477 cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 478 memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 479 families. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the482fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall483use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 485 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 486 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 487 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 488 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 489 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 490 491 administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 492 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 493 494 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar495receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the496Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the497contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.498

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 499 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 500 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 501 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 502 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 503

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 504 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 505 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 506 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 507 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 508 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 509 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 510 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 511 lives to the fullest. 512

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar513receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to514

Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the515contributions into its general account to be used for purposes516of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.517

The school shall 1112 use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1113 in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1114 developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1115 the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1116 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1117 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1118

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1141 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1142 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1143 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1144 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1145 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1146 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1147 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1149receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1150Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1151corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1152contributions for any political purpose.1153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1154receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1155Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1156Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1157any political purpose.1158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1159receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1160Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1161high school shall not use the contributions for any political1162purpose.1163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1164receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to1165Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use1166contributions to fund college and career technical training1167scholarships for students.1168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1169receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1170friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1171to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1172emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1174receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1175Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1176activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1177

city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1178 (C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1179 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1180 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1181 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1182 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1183 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1184 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1185 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1186

Sec. 4503.53. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1187 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, 1188 motorcycle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the 1189 registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the 1190 registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Ohio Carpenters" 1191 license plates. The application may be combined with a request 1192 for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 1193 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed 1194 application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) 1195 and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the 1196 applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of 1197 "Ohio Carpenters" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1198 validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1199 the Revised Code. 1200

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1201 inscribed on the license plates, "Ohio Carpenters" license 1202 plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are 1203 selected by representatives of the Ohio carpenters union and 1204 approved by the registrar. "Ohio Carpenters" license plates 1205 shall display county identification stickers that identify the 1206 county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the 1207

Section 2. That existing sections 4501.21 and 4503.53 of1233the Revised Code are hereby repealed.1234

Section 3. Section 4501.21 of the Revised Code is1235presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended1236

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by H.B. 74, H.B. 110, H.B. 281, H.B. 291, and H.B. 578, all of 1237 the 134th General Assembly. The General Assembly, applying the 1238 principle stated in division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised 1239 Code that amendments are to be harmonized if reasonably capable 1240 of simultaneous operation, finds that the composite is the 1241 resulting version of the section in effect prior to the 1242 effective date of the section as presented in this act. 1243
