## A BILL

To amend sections 3313.6113 and 3333.94 and to	1
enact section 6301.22 of the Revised Code to	2
permit the Governor's Office of Workforce	3
Transformation to develop industry-recognized	4
credentials and certificate programs.	5

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3313.6113 and 3333.94 be amended	6
and section 6301.22 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	7
follows:	8
Sec. 3313.6113. (A) The superintendent of public	9
Jee. Jee. (II) The Superimediaties of public	5
instruction, in collaboration with the governor's office of	10
workforce transformation and representatives of business	11
organizations, shall establish a committee to develop a list of	12
industry-recognized credentials and licenses that may be used to	13
qualify for a high school diploma under division (A)(3) of	14
section 3313.618 of the Revised Code and shall be used for state	15
report card purposes under section 3302.03 of the Revised Code.	16
The state superintendent shall appoint the members of the	17
committee not later than January 1, 2018.	18

(B) The committee shall do the following: 19

(1) Establish criteria for acceptable industry-recognized	20
credentials and licenses aligned with the in-demand jobs list	21
published by the department of job and family services;	22
(2) Review the list of industry-recognized credentials and	23
licenses that was in existence on January 1, 2018, and update	24
the list as it considers necessary;	25
(3) <u>Review any industry-recognized credentials submitted</u>	26
by the governor's office of workforce transformation under	27
division (C) of section 6301.22 of the Revised Code, and update	28
the list as the committee considers necessary;	29
(4) Review and update the list of industry-recognized	30
credentials and licenses at least biennially.	31
Sec. 3333.94. (A) As used in this section:	32
(1) "In-demand job" means a job that is determined to be	33
in demand in this state and its regions under section 6301.11 of	34
the Revised Code.	35
(2) "Ohio technical center" means a center that provides	36
adult technical education services and is recognized by the	37
chancellor of higher education.	38
(3) "State institution of higher education" has the same	39
meaning as in section 3345.011 of the Revised Code.	40
(B) Not later than January 1, 2018, the The chancellor of	41
higher education shall create an inventory of both of the	42
<u>following:</u>	43
(1) All credit and non-credit certificate programs and	44
industry-recognized credentials offered at state institutions of	45
higher education and Ohio technical centers that align with in-	46
demand jobs in the state <u>;</u>	47

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(2) As determined appropriate by the chancellor, any	48
industry-recognized credentials or certificate programs	49
submitted by the governor's office of workforce transformation	50
under division (C) of section 6301.22 of the Revised Code.	51
When awarding funds from the OhioMeansJobs workforce	52
development revolving loan fund established under section	53
6301.14 of the Revised Code, the chancellor shall give	54
preference to certificate programs that support adult learners	55
and are included in the inventory.	56
Sec. 6301.22. (A) An employer in this state may petition	57
the governor's office of workforce transformation to develop an	58
industry-recognized credential or a certificate program. The	59
proposed credential or certificate program must be aligned with	60
the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the workforce needs	61
of the state.	62
(B) The governor's office of workforce transformation, in	63
consultation with the department of education, the chancellor of	64
higher education, and other stakeholders, may develop an	65
industry-recognized credential or a certificate program in	66
response to a petition received under division (A) of this	67
section. The office may prioritize credential or certificate	68
programs related to in-demand jobs, as determined in section	69
6301.11 of the Revised Code.	70
(C) An industry-recognized credential or a certificate	71
program developed under this division shall include any	72
curriculum, standards, or materials determined necessary by the	73
governor's office of workforce transformation.	74
(D) The governor's office of workforce transformation	75
shall submit an industry-recognized credential or certificate	76

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program developed under this section to either of the following,	77
as appropriate:	78
(1) The committee established by the superintendent of	79
public instruction under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code;	80
(2) The chancellor, both for the purposes of section	81
3333.94 of the Revised Code and any other purpose determined	82
appropriate by the chancellor.	83
Section 2. That existing sections 3313.6113 and 3333.94 of	84
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	85

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
