BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3301.16 be amended and section	4
3301.164 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3301.16. Pursuant to standards prescribed by the	6
state board of education as provided in division (D) of section	7
3301.07 of the Revised Code, the state board shall classify and	8
charter school districts and individual schools within each	9
district except that no charter shall be granted to a nonpublic	10
school unless the school complies with divisions (K)(1)(a) and	11
(b) of section 3301.0711, as applicable, and section sections	12
3313.612 <u>and 3301.164</u> of the Revised Code.	13
In the course of considering the charter of a new school	14
in the course of considering the charter of a new school	T 4
district created under section 3311.26 or 3311.38 of the Revised	15
Code, the state board shall require the party proposing creation	16
of the district to submit to the board a map, certified by the	17

county auditor of the county in which the proposed new district
is located, showing the boundaries of the proposed new district.
In the case of a proposed new district located in more than one
county, the map shall be certified by the county auditor of each
county in which the proposed district is located.

The state board shall revoke the charter of any school district or school which fails to meet the standards for elementary and high schools as prescribed by the board. The state board shall also revoke the charter of any nonpublic school that does not comply with division (K)(1)(a) of section 3301.0711, if applicable, and section—sections 3313.612 and 3301.164 of the Revised Code.

In the issuance and revocation of school district or school charters, the state board shall be governed by the provisions of Chapter 119. of the Revised Code.

No school district, or individual school operated by a school district, shall operate without a charter issued by the state board under this section.

In case a school district charter is revoked pursuant to this section, the state board may dissolve the school district and transfer its territory to one or more adjacent districts. An equitable division of the funds, property, and indebtedness of the school district shall be made by the state board among the receiving districts. The board of education of a receiving district shall accept such territory pursuant to the order of the state board. Prior to dissolving the school district, the state board shall notify the appropriate educational service center governing board and all adjacent school district boards of education of its intention to do so. Boards so notified may make recommendations to the state board regarding the proposed

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dissolution and subsequent transfer of territory. Except as	48

ordered by the state board shall become effective on the date	50
specified by the state board, but the date shall be at least	51
thirty days following the date of issuance of the order.	52
A high school is one of higher grade than an elementary	53
