BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4399.18 be amended and section	7
4399.19 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4399.18. (A) Notwithstanding division (A) of section	9
2307.60 of the Revised Code and except as otherwise provided in	10
this section, no person, and no executor or administrator of the	11
person, who suffers personal injury, death, or property damage	12
as a result of the actions of an intoxicated person has a cause	13
of action against any liquor permit holder or an employee of a	14
liquor permit holder who sold beer or intoxicating liquor to the	15
intoxicated person unless the both of the following apply:	16
(1) The personal injury, death, or property damage	17
occurred on the permit holder's premises or in a parking lot	18

under the control of the permit holder—and.		
(2) The personal injury, death, or property damage was	20	
proximately caused by the negligence of the permit holder or an	21	
employee of the permit holder. A	22	
(B) A person has a cause of action against a permit holder	23	
or an employee of a permit holder for personal injury, death, or	24	
property damage caused by the negligent actions of an	25	
intoxicated person occurring off the premises or away from a	26	
parking lot under the permit holder's control only when both of	27	
the following can be shown by a preponderance of the evidence:	28	
(A) (1) The permit holder or an employee of the permit	29	
holder knowingly sold an intoxicating beverage to at least one	30	
of the following:	31	
$\frac{(1)}{(a)}$ A noticeably intoxicated person in violation of	32	
division (B) of section 4301.22 of the Revised Code;	33	
(2) (b) A person in violation of section 4301.69 of the	34	
Revised Code.		
(B) (2) The person's intoxication proximately caused the	36	
personal injury, death, or property damage.	37	
(C) A permit holder or employee of a permit holder is not	38	
liable in a civil action under division (A) or (B) of this	39	
section if both of the following apply:	40	
(1) The permit holder and all of the permit holder's	41	
employees have successfully completed the training required	42	
under section 4399.19 of the Revised Code.	43	
(2) The permit holder and any employee of the permit	44	
holder followed all protocols specified in the training program	45	
with respect to the intoxicated person who proximately caused	46	

personal injury, death, or property damage.		
(D) Notwithstanding sections 4399.02 and 4399.05 of the	48	
Revised Code, no person, and no executor or administrator of the		
person, who suffers personal injury, death, or property damage		
as a result of the actions of an intoxicated person has a cause	51	
of action against the owner of a building or premises who rents	52	
or leases the building or premises to a liquor permit holder	53	
against whom a cause of action may be brought under this	54	
section, except when the owner and the permit holder are the	55	
same person.	56	
Sec. 4399.19. (A) A permit holder and the permit holder's	57	
employees shall complete a training program approved by the	58	
superintendent of liquor control under division (B) of this	59	
section.		
(B) The superintendent shall approve a training program	61	
that includes all of the following:	62	
(1) Instruction on the statutes and rules that govern the	63	
sale of beer, wine, mixed beverages, and intoxicating liquor in	64	
this state;		
(2) Instruction on preventing the illegal service of beer,	66	
wine, mixed beverages, and intoxicating liquor to persons under	67	
<pre>twenty-one years of age;</pre>		
(3) Instruction on recognizing when to decrease and stop	69	
serving beer, wine, mixed beverages, or intoxicating liquor to a		
person due to the risk of intoxication;		
(4) Use of conflict management skills in alcohol-related	72	
situations.		
(C) In approving the program under division (B) of this	74	

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section, the superintendent shall establish the number of hours	75
required to complete the training and a method for determining	76
if a liquor permit holder or an employee of a liquor permit	77
holder successfully completed the training.	78
Section 2. That existing section 4399.18 of the Revised Code is hereby repealed.	79 80
Section 3. This act shall be known as Hayden's Law.	81
