BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. All items in this act are hereby appropriated out	8
of any moneys in the state treasury to the credit of the	9
designated fund. For all appropriations made in this act, those in	10
the first column are for fiscal year 2020, and those in the second	11
column are for fiscal year 2021. The appropriations made in this	12
act are in addition to any other appropriations made for the	13
biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.	14

(A) "Apprentice" and "apprenticeship agreement" have the	166
meaning defined in section 4111.25 4139.01 of the Revised Code.	167
(B) "Related and supplemental instructions" means training	168
offered, conducted, supervised, or given under the sponsorship of	169
any joint apprenticeship committee or other sponsoring	170
organization to apprentices, which training is given in addition	171
to the approved schedule of work experience through employment,	172
and which is to be credited towards the minimum hours of related	173
and supplemental instructions required by section 4139.01 of the	174
Revised Code.	175
(C) "Pre-apprentice" means a person who receives formal	176
classroom training designed to provide the person with the basic	177
education, attitudes, skills, trade knowledge, and motivation	178
necessary to enter a formal apprenticeship program.	179
(D) "Entry-level trainee" means a person who possesses	180
experience that would qualify the person as a journeyperson but	181
for the existence of certain other disqualifying conditions and	182
who receives on-the-job training accompanied by classroom	183
instruction outside of normal working hours.	184
(E) "Journeyperson trainee" means a person with journeyperson	185

status in a given trade who receives classroom and laboratory

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training for the purpose of broadening the person's skills and	187
acquainting the person with new techniques and ideas in the trade.	188
Sec. 4131.03. (A) For the relief of persons who are entitled	189
to receive benefits by virtue of the federal act, there is hereby	190
established a coal-workers pneumoconiosis fund, which shall be	191
separate from the funds established and administered pursuant to	192
Chapter 4123. of the Revised Code. The fund shall consist of	193
premiums and other payments thereto by subscribers who elect to	194
subscribe to the fund to insure the payment of benefits required	195
by the federal act.	196
(B) The coal-workers pneumoconiosis fund shall be in the	197
custody of the treasurer of state. The bureau of workers'	198
compensation shall make disbursements from the fund to those	199
persons entitled to payment therefrom and in the amounts required	200
pursuant to sections 4131.01 to 4131.06 of the Revised Code. All	201
investment earnings of the fund shall be credited to the fund.	202
The director of natural resources annually may request the	203
administrator of workers' compensation to transfer a portion of	204
the funds from the net position of the coal-workers pneumoconiosis	205
fund to the mining regulation and safety fund created in section	206
1513.30 of the Revised Code for the purposes specified in that	207
section. If the administrator receives a request, the	208
administrator may transfer an amount not to exceed one million	209
dollars on the first day of July or as soon as possible	210
thereafter.	211
The administrator, with the advice and consent of the bureau	212
of workers' compensation board of directors, shall adopt rules in	213
accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code governing the	214
transfer to ensure the solvency of the coal-workers pneumoconiosis	215
fund. For that purpose, the administrator may establish tests in	216

the rules based on measures of net assets, liabilities, expenses,

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interest, dividend income, or other factors that the administrator	218
determines appropriate that may be applied before a transfer.	219
(C) The administrator shall have the same powers to invest	220
any of the surplus or reserve belonging to the coal-workers	221
pneumoconiosis fund as are delegated to the administrator under	222
section 4123.44 of the Revised Code with respect to the state	223
insurance fund.	224
(D) If the administrator determines that reinsurance of the	225
risks of the coal-workers pneumoconiosis fund is necessary to	226
assure solvency of the fund, the administrator may:	227
(1) Enter into contracts for the purchase of reinsurance	228
coverage of the risks of the fund with any company or agency	229
authorized by law to issue contracts of reinsurance;	230
(2) Pay the cost of reinsurance from the fund;	231
(3) Include the costs of reinsurance as a liability and	232
estimated liability of the fund.	233
Section 7. That existing sections 4123.038 and 4131.03 of the	234
Revised Code are hereby repealed.	235
