A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Го	urge the United States Congress to restore the	1
	Department of Defense's superior warfighting	2
	principles of recruiting, assigning, training,	3
	promoting, and retaining personnel solely based on	4
	merit and ensuring such personnel maintain and display	5
	a warrior ethos, and to name this resolution the	6
	"Restoration of America's Readiness (ROAR)	7
	Resolution."	8

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The United States became the world's greatest	9	
warfighting nation shortly after its founding, a fact clearly	10	
demonstrated in the 1900s and early 2000s through its engagement	11	
in two World Wars and several other military campaigns	12	
throughout the globe, establishing a deterrent effect that has		
prevented another World War for almost 80 years; and		
WHEREAS, The United States' military dominance in	15	
warfighting also came about through the ability of personnel to	16	
have and maintain a warrior ethos, one in which they are able to		
transition from being a kind, compassionate individual in		

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peacetime to one who is willing and able to engage an enemy in	19		
battle with violence and lethality, and this includes support			
personnel who may not typically be called upon to engage an	21		
enemy face-to-face but nonetheless may find themselves in	22		
situations that require them to do so; and	23		
WHEREAS, Over the past several years, the United States	24		
Department of Defense and its military services have engaged in	25		
various practices eroding these warfighting principles to the	26		
point at which United States military dominance has been called			
into serious question. Such practices include:	28		
(1) Overemphasizing and relying on diversity and inclusion	29		
in all its forms, including gender, gender identity, race, and	30		
sexual preference, as a primary determinant in how military	31		
forces should be comprised without providing credible and	32		
verifiable evidence that such a prescribed composition results	33		
in higher job performance, unit effectiveness, and mission	34		
accomplishment, as opposed to a model in which a meritocracy-	35		
based force composition is used;	36		
(2) Making nonsensical "unconscious bias" training	37		
mandatory for all military and civilian personnel;	38		
(3) Instituting mandatory "emergency use only" COVID-19	39		
vaccines with little regard to individual medical concerns in	40		
light of the Anthrax vaccine mandate problems of the late 1990s	41		
and denying almost all requests for exemptions based on	42		
religious grounds, which is particularly troubling given the	43		
recent decision by the United States Department of Defense to	44		
rescind the COVID-19 vaccine mandate; and	45		
(4) Requiring mandatory training at the United States Air	46		
Force Academy to incorporate "person-centered" and gender			
neutral language when describing individuals and to request	48		
cadets to consider using the term "parent" or "caregiver" rather	49		

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than "mother" or "father" as not to offend those that may come	50
from a different parenting background; and	51
(5) Requiring mandatory indoctrination of every cadet at	52
the United States Military Academy in Critical Race Theory, a	53
theory focused on dividing the American population along racial	54
lines, which ignores the progress accomplished within the United	55
States since our Civil War of the 1860s, so as to manufacture	56
voting blocks for radical politicians, and creates distrust of	57
the leadership of the United States Army; and	58
WHEREAS, The United States' military dominance in	59
warfighting came about through reliance on the concept of	60
meritocracy, in which personnel are recruited, assigned to	61
specialties, assigned to positions within a unit, retained, and	62
promoted based on their demonstrated aptitude and performance in	63
the roles they are assigned to perform, regardless of their	64
race, gender, sexual preference, or other person-centric	65
identifiers; and	66
WHEREAS, Such practices are having a detrimental effect on	67
recruitment, as the United States Army was 15,000 soldiers short	68
of its 2022 recruiting goals, the worst recruiting year on	69
record since the Armed Forces switched to an all-volunteer force	70
nearly 50 years ago, and the remaining branches of the Armed	71
Forces are well behind their historic goal rates as they enter	72
into the 2023 recruiting season; and	73
WHEREAS, Recent studies have found that most young	74
Americans are not fit for military service, with the Department	75
of Defense estimating that just two percent of those between the	76
ages of 17 and 21 years have the desired combination of strong	77
academic credentials, adequate physical fitness, and an interest	
in serving; and	79
WHEREAS, The combination of an incapable and uninterested	80

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recruiting age group and non-merit-based practices calls into	81	
serious question whether the United States military currently		
has a sufficient number of members who hold a warrior ethos		
needed to effectively engage an enemy; and		
WHEREAS, Those with the necessary warrior ethos currently	85	
serving in the United States military are more likely to leave	86	
service, and those with the necessary warrior ethos before	87	
entering into service are more likely to refrain from enlisting	88	
as they discover the composition and practices of the Armed	89	
Services as referenced herein; therefore be it		
RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 135th General	91	
Assembly, urge the United States Congress to use its	92	
authorization and appropriation authorities to prohibit the use	93	
of such "woke" social engineering and experimentation practices,	94	
which are eroding military effectiveness, and to mandate a		
return to a merit-based system for military force development		
and composition; and be it further	97	
RESOLVED, That this resolution be known as the "Restoration	98	
of America's Readiness (ROAR) Resolution;" and be it further	99	
RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives	100	
transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the	101	
President of the United States, the President of the United	102	
States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of	103	
Representatives, and each member of the Ohio delegation to the		
United States Congress.
