Recognizing Workers Memorial Day 2019 in Ohio.

WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives of the	1
133rd General Assembly of Ohio are pleased to recognize April 28,	2
2019, as Workers Memorial Day in Ohio; and	3
WHEREAS, After decades of struggle by workers and their	4
unions, the Occupational Safety and Health Act and Mine Safety and	5
Health Act were passed to improve safety in the workplace, but	6
although there have been significant improvements, millions of	7
workers are killed or injured on the job each year because of	8
dangerous working conditions. Designated in the Ohio Revised Code	9
in 1990, Workers Memorial Day is celebrated every April 28, when	10
organizations throughout Ohio remember these workers by	11
recommitting themselves to stopping on-the-job injuries and	12
fatalities in the future and to fighting for better job safety and	13
health protections; and	14
WHEREAS, Countless individuals throughout our vast labor	15
force have helped to build this nation and have created the	16
climate of abundance we presently enjoy. The successful struggle	17
for effective and responsible employee representation has	18
guaranteed that working men and women have a strong voice in the	19
