A 1997 graduate of Allen East High School, Nathan Carse worked as an engineer before joining the U.S. Army, and he was serving with the 2nd Engineer Battalion, 176th Engineer Brigade in Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom when he was killed in the line of duty. His valiant efforts were truly admirable, and his absence will be keenly felt; and
