BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

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(B) Standards for collection of food samples from retail 18 food establishments for purposes of identifying adulteration and 19 misbranding; 20 (C) Records to be generated and maintained by licensed 21 retail food establishments; 22 (D) Appeals of proposed suspensions and revocations of 23 retail food establishment licenses and appeals of suspensions of 24 licenses issued for violations presenting a clear and present 25 danger to the public health; 26 (E) Standards and procedures, including a schedule of 27 frequency, for conducting inspections of retail food 28 establishments; 29 (F) Standards and procedures for determining during an 30 inspection whether articles should be removed from use because 31 of a clear and present danger to the public health; 32 (G) Standards and procedures for conducting investigations 33 of complaints pertaining to retail food establishments; 34 (H) (1) Surveys conducted by the director to determine 35 whether boards of health are qualified and have the capacity to 36 administer and enforce the provisions of this chapter and the 37 rules adopted under it applicable to retail food establishments 38 and to abide by the Ohio uniform food safety code;. written or electronic assessment that complies with all of the

(i) It is developed by the director in consultation with
representatives from the Ohio environmental health association
and the association of Ohio health commissioners.

(ii) It does not exceed fifty questions in length. 56

(iii) In order to pass the assessment, the individual must correctly answer eighty per cent or more of the questions in the assessment. Questions on the exam shall be derived from the most common violations cited during the previous inspection year.

(iv) The individual is allowed to review the Ohio uniform food safety code during the assessment.

(2) The director, in consultation with representatives 63 from the Ohio environmental health association and the 64 association of Ohio health commissioners, shall review and 65 update the assessment described in division (H)(1)(b) of this 66 section on at least a biennial basis. 67

(3) For purposes of any field review portion of the 68 survey, the director may require a registered environmental 69 health specialist or environmental health specialist in training 70 to participate in the field review for training and educational 71 purposes. However, the director shall not use such participation 72 to evaluate whether the registered environmental health 73 specialist or environmental health specialist in training has 74 75 sufficient knowledge of this chapter, rules adopted under it,
