BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 122.97, 122.971, 122.972,	6
122.973, 122.974, 122.975, 122.976, 122.977, and 122.978 of the	7
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 122.97. As used in sections 122.97 to 122.977 of the	9
Revised Code:	10
(A) "Last-mile infrastructure" means broadband	11
infrastructure that connects the broadband service provider's	12
network to the end user customer's on-premise telecommunications	13
equipment.	14
(B) "Middle-mile infrastructure" means broadband	15
infrastructure that connects a broadband service provider's core	16
network infrastructure to last-mile infrastructure	17

(C) "Political subdivision" has the same meaning as in	18
section 122.9511 of the Revised Code.	19
(D) "Unserved area" means an area that is not offered	20
broadband service, as that service is defined by the most recent	21
broadband progress report issued by the federal communications	22
commission. Verification of whether broadband is offered in a	23
particular area shall be through the national broadband map,	24
maintained by the national telecommunications and information	25
administration.	26
Sec. 122.971. The director of development services shall	27
establish the Ohio broadband development grant program to	28
provide funds to extend broadband service to unserved areas of	29
the state. The program shall incorporate the state's policy to	30
provide incentives for competing providers of telecommunications	31
service to provide advanced, high-quality telecommunications	32
service to citizens throughout the state, as set forth in	33
division (A)(2) of section 4927.02 of the Revised Code.	34
Sec. 122.972. Recipients of a grant under the Ohio	35
broadband development grant program shall use the funds for the	36
construction of broadband infrastructure to serve unserved	37
areas. Construction shall include the acquisition and	38
installation of middle-mile and last-mile infrastructure.	39
Construction may also include any of the following: project	40
planning, obtaining construction permits, construction of	41
facilities, purchasing equipment, and installation and testing	42
of the broadband service.	43
Sec. 122.973. The following may apply for a grant under	44
the Ohio broadband development grant program:	45
(A) Private businesses;	46

(B) Political subdivisions;	47
(C) Nonprofit entities organized to provide	48
telecommunications services;	49
(D) Co-ops organized to provide phone and internet	50

Sec. 122.974. An applicant for a grant under this section	52
shall provide the following information on an application	53
prescribed by the director of development services:	54

(C) Evidence regarding the unserved nature of the	58

Sec. 122.975. (A) The director of development services	70
shall evaluate applications and award grants under the Ohio	71
broadband development grant program. The director may give	72

priority to applications that do the following:	73
(1) Offer new or substantially upgraded broadband service	74
to important community institutions, including libraries,	75
educational institutions, public safety facilities, and	76
healthcare facilities;	77
(2) Facilitate the use of telemedicine and electronic	78
health records;	79
(3) Serve economically distressed areas of the state, as	80
measured by indices of unemployment, poverty, or population loss	81
that are significantly greater than the statewide average;	82
(4) Provide technical support and train residents,	83
businesses, and institutions in the community served by the	84
<pre>project to utilize broadband service;</pre>	85
(5) Include a plan to promote the newly available	86
broadband services in the community;	87
(6) Provide evidence of strong support for the project	88
from citizens, government, businesses, and institutions in the	89
<pre>community;</pre>	90
(7) Provide access to broadband service to a greater	91
<pre>number of unserved households and businesses;</pre>	92
(8) Leverage greater amounts of funding for the project	93
<pre>from public and private sources;</pre>	94
(9) Provide for the implementation of open access networks	95
that offer wholesale access to network infrastructure or	96

(B) The director shall endeavor to award grants under this	98
section to qualified applicants in all regions of the state.	99
