BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.569 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	29

registrar collects in the fund as follows:

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The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31 pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 32 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 33 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 34 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 35 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 36 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 37 other abortion-related activities. 38

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 47 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 48 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 49

and	autism	awareness	efforts	throughout	the	state.		50
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.
