Γ	To amend sections 4507.50 and 4507.52 of the	1
	Revised Code to allow any veteran and any	2
	unemployed mobility impaired person to obtain a	3
	free identification card that is valid for eight	4
	years.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4507.50 and 4507.52 of the	6
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 4507.50. (A) The registrar of motor vehicles or a	8
deputy registrar, upon receipt of an application filed in	9
compliance with section 4507.51 of the Revised Code by any	10
person who is a resident or a temporary resident of this state	11
and, except as otherwise provided in this section, is not	12
licensed as an operator of a motor vehicle in this state or	13
another licensing jurisdiction, and, except as provided in	14
division (B) or (C) of this section, upon receipt of a fee of	15
three dollars and fifty cents, shall issue an identification	16
card to that person.	17
Any person who is a resident or temporary resident of this	18

state whose Ohio driver's or commercial driver's license has

been suspended or canceled, upon application in compliance with 20 section 4507.51 of the Revised Code and, except as provided in 21 division (B) or (C) of this section, payment of a fee of three 22 dollars and fifty cents, may be issued a temporary 23 identification card. The temporary identification card shall be 24 identical to an identification card, except that it shall be 2.5 printed on its face with a statement that the card is valid 26 during the effective dates of the suspension or cancellation of 27 the cardholder's license, or until the birthday of the 28 cardholder in the fourth year after the date on which it is 29 issued, whichever is shorter. The cardholder shall surrender the 30 identification card to the registrar or any deputy registrar 31 before the cardholder's driver's or commercial driver's license 32 is restored or reissued. 33

Except as provided in division (B) or (C) of this section, the deputy registrar shall be allowed a fee equal to the amount established under section 4503.038 of the Revised Code for each identification card issued under this section. The fee allowed to the deputy registrar shall be in addition to the fee for issuing an identification card.

Neither the registrar nor any deputy registrar shall 40 charge a fee in excess of one dollar and fifty cents for 41 laminating an identification card or temporary identification 42 card. A deputy registrar laminating such a card shall retain the 43 entire amount of the fee charged for lamination, less the actual 44 cost to the registrar of the laminating materials used for that 45 lamination, as specified in the contract executed by the bureau 46 for the laminating materials and laminating equipment. The 47 deputy registrar shall forward the amount of the cost of the 48 laminating materials to the registrar for deposit as provided in 49 this section. 50

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The fee collected for issuing an identification card under 51 this section, except the fee allowed to the deputy registrar, 52 shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the 53 public safety - highway purposes fund created in section 4501.06 54 of the Revised Code. 55

(B) A disabled <u>Any</u> veteran who has a service-connected disability rated at one hundred per cent by the veterans' administration may apply to the registrar or a deputy registrar for the issuance to that veteran of an identification card or a temporary identification card under this section without payment of any fee prescribed in division (A) of this section, including any lamination fee.

An application made under division (B) of this sectionshall be accompanied by such documentary evidence of disabilityas the registrar may require by rule.

(C) A <u>nonveteran</u> resident who is eligible for an 66 identification card with an expiration date that is in 67 accordance with division (A)(8)(b) of section 4507.52 of the 68 Revised Code and who is currently unemployed may apply to the 69 70 registrar or a deputy registrar for the issuance of an identification card under this section without payment of any 71 fee as prescribed in division (A) of this section, including any 72 lamination fee. 73

An application made under division (C) of this section 74 shall be accompanied by such documentary evidence of disability 75 and unemployment as the registrar may require by rule. 76

Sec. 4507.52. (A) (1) Each identification card issued by77the registrar of motor vehicles or a deputy registrar shall78display a distinguishing number assigned to the cardholder, and79

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shall display the following inscription: 80 "STATE OF OHIO IDENTIFICATION CARD 81 This card is not valid for the purpose of operating a 82 motor vehicle. It is provided solely for the purpose of 83 establishing the identity of the bearer described on the card, 84 who currently is not licensed to operate a motor vehicle in the 85 state of Ohio." 86 (2) The identification card shall display substantially 87 the same information as contained in the application and as 88 described in division (A)(1) of section 4507.51 of the Revised 89 Code, but shall not display the cardholder's social security 90 number unless the cardholder specifically requests that the 91 cardholder's social security number be displayed on the card. If 92 federal law requires the cardholder's social security number to 93 be displayed on the identification card, the social security 94 number shall be displayed on the card notwithstanding this 95 section. 96 (3) The identification card also shall display the color 97 photograph of the cardholder. 98 (4) If the cardholder has executed a durable power of 99 attorney for health care or a declaration governing the use or 100 continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life-101 sustaining treatment and has specified that the cardholder 102 wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder 103 has executed either type of instrument, the card also shall 104 display any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the 105 cardholder has executed either type of instrument. 106 (5) If the cardholder has specified that the cardholder 107

wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder 108

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is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of
the United States and has presented a copy of the cardholder's
DD-214 form or an equivalent document, the card also shall
display any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the
cardholder is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed
forces of the United States.

(6) The card shall be sealed in transparent plastic or
similar material and shall be so designed as to prevent its
reproduction or alteration without ready detection.

(7) The identification card for persons under twenty-one 118 years of age shall have characteristics prescribed by the 119 registrar distinguishing it from that issued to a person who is 120 twenty-one years of age or older, except that an identification 121 card issued to a person who applies no more than thirty days 122 before the applicant's twenty-first birthday shall have the 123 characteristics of an identification card issued to a person who 124 is twenty-one years of age or older. 125

(8) (a) Except as provided in division (A) (8) (b) of this
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section, every identification card issued to a resident of this
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state shall expire, unless canceled or surrendered earlier, on
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the birthday of the cardholder in the fourth year after the date
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on which it is issued.

(b) The registrar or a deputy registrar shall issue an 131 identification card to a resident of this state who is 132 permanently or irreversibly disabled, a mobility impaired 133 person, or a veteran that shall expire, unless canceled or 134 surrendered earlier, on the birthday of the cardholder in the 135 eighth year after the date on which it is issued. The registrar 136 shall issue a reminder notice to a cardholder, at the last known 137 address of the cardholder, six months before the identification 138

card is scheduled to expire. The registrar shall adopt rules	139	
governing the documentation a cardholder shall submit to certify		
that the cardholder is permanently or irreversibly disabled, a	141	
mobility impaired person, or a veteran.		
As used in this section, "permanently :	143	
(i) "Permanently or irreversibly disabled" means a	144	
condition of disability from which there is no present	145	
indication of recovery <u>.</u>	146	
(ii) "Mobility impaired person" has the same meaning as in	147	
section 955.011 of the Revised Code.	148	
(c) Every identification card issued to a temporary	149	
resident shall expire in accordance with rules adopted by the	150	
registrar and is nonrenewable, but may be replaced with a new	151	
identification card upon the applicant's compliance with all	152	
applicable requirements.	153	
(9) A cardholder may renew the cardholder's identification	154	
card within ninety days prior to the day on which it expires by	155	
filing an application and paying the prescribed fee in	156	
accordance with section 4507.50 of the Revised Code.	157	
(10) If a cardholder applies for a driver's or commercial	158	
driver's license in this state or another licensing	159	
jurisdiction, the cardholder shall surrender the cardholder's	160	
identification card to the registrar or any deputy registrar	161	
before the license is issued.	162	
(B)(1) If a card is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, the	163	
person to whom the card was issued may obtain a duplicate by	164	
doing both of the following:	165	
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mutilation to the registrar or a deputy registrar;167(b) Filing an application and presenting documentary168evidence under section 4507.51 of the Revised Code.169

(2) Any person who loses a card and, after obtaining a
duplicate, finds the original, immediately shall surrender the
original to the registrar or a deputy registrar.

(3) A cardholder may obtain a replacement identification
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card that reflects any change of the cardholder's name by
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furnishing suitable proof of the change to the registrar or a
deputy registrar and surrendering the cardholder's existing
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card.

(4) (a) When a cardholder applies for a duplicate or
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obtains a replacement identification card, the cardholder shall
pay a fee of two dollars and fifty cents. A deputy registrar
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shall be allowed an additional fee equal to the amount
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established under section 4503.038 of the Revised Code for
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issuing a duplicate or replacement identification card.

(b) A disabled Any veteran who is a cardholder and has a 184 service-connected disability rated at one hundred per cent by 185 the veterans' administration may apply to the registrar or a 186 deputy registrar for the issuance of a duplicate or replacement 187 identification card without payment of any fee prescribed in 188 this section, and without payment of any lamination fee if the 189 disabled veteran would not be required to pay a lamination fee 190 in connection with the issuance of an identification card or 191 temporary identification card as provided in division (B) of 192 section 4507.50 of the Revised Code. 193

(c) A <u>nonveteran</u> resident who is permanently or
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 irreversibly disabled<u>or a mobility impaired person</u> and who is
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unemployed may apply to the registrar or a deputy registrar for 196
the issuance of a duplicate or replacement identification card 197
without payment of any fee prescribed in this section, and 198
without payment of any lamination fee, if the resident would not 199
be required to pay any fee in connection with the issuance of an 200
identification card as provided in division (C) of section 201
4507.50 of the Revised Code. 202

(5) A duplicate or replacement identification card expires203on the same date as the card it replaces.204

(C) The registrar shall cancel any card upon determining 205 that the card was obtained unlawfully, issued in error, or was 206 altered. The registrar also shall cancel any card that is 207 surrendered to the registrar or to a deputy registrar after the 208 holder has obtained a duplicate, replacement, or driver's or 209 commercial driver's license. 210

(D) (1) No agent of the state or its political subdivisions
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shall condition the granting of any benefit, service, right, or
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privilege upon the possession by any person of an identification
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card. Nothing in this section shall preclude any publicly
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operated or franchised transit system from using an
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identification card for the purpose of granting benefits or
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services of the system.

(2) No person shall be required to apply for, carry, orpossess an identification card.219

(E) Except in regard to an identification card issued to a 220
person who applies no more than thirty days before the 221
applicant's twenty-first birthday, neither the registrar nor any 222
deputy registrar shall issue an identification card to a person 223
under twenty-one years of age that does not have the 224

characteristics prescribed by the registrar distinguishing it	225
from the identification card issued to persons who are twenty-	226
one years of age or older.	227
(F) Whoever violates division (E) of this section is	228
guilty of a minor misdemeanor.	229
Section 2. That existing sections 4507.50 and 4507.52 of	230
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the Revised Code are hereby repealed.
