A RESOLUTION

To urge Congress to pass the Stop Our Scourge Act of	1
2023, directing the U.S. Secretary of Homeland	2
Security to designate illicit fentanyl as a	3
weapon of mass destruction.	4

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, According to the U.S. Drug Enforcement	5
Administration, fentanyl is a synthetic opioid 50 times more	6
potent than heroin and 100 times more potent than morphine; and	7
WHEREAS, According to data from the Centers for Disease	8
Control and Prevention (CDC), fentanyl has become the number one	9
cause of death for Americans ages 18 to 45; and	10
WHEREAS, According to the CDC, pharmaceutical fentanyl is	11
prescribed by doctors to treat severe pain, especially after	12
surgery or for advanced stage cancer, and may also be used as an	13
anesthetic or in other hospital or treatment settings legally;	14
and	15
WHEREAS, Illicit fentanyl is often illegally made and is	16
distributed through illegal drug markets in different forms,	17
including liquid or powder; and	18
WHEREAS, According to the CDC, fentanyl and drugs similar	19
in chemical structure to fentanyl are being mixed into	20

counterfeit opioid pills, heroin, cocaine, marijuana, and methamphetamine, and people who only use non-opioid drugs are more likely to overdose if they are exposed to drugs mixed with opioids, including fentanyl; and

WHEREAS, According to the National Institute on Drug Abuse, overdose deaths involving synthetic opioids, primarily fentanyl, were reported to be 70,601 in 2021; and

WHEREAS, According to the Ohio Department of Health, fentanyl was involved in 80 per cent of Ohio's unintentional drug overdose deaths in 2021; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Customs and Border Protection seized more than 27,000 pounds of illicit fentanyl in fiscal year 2023; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Customs and Border Patrol's fentanyl seizures have increased more than 800 per cent since fiscal year 2019; and

WHEREAS, In 2002, in response to Chechen rebels taking over 800 hostages in a Moscow theater, Russia deployed an unknown gas, later confirmed by the Russian Health Minister to contain fentanyl-related compounds, to neutralize the rebels, which resulted in the death of 117 hostages from effects of the gas; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the Senate of the 135th General Assembly of the State of Ohio, urge the United States Congress to pass the Stop Our Scourge Act of 2023, directing the U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security to designate illicit fentanyl a weapon of mass destruction; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit duly47authenticated copies of this resolution to the President Pro48Tempore and Secretary of the United States Senate, Speaker and49Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, members of50the Ohio Congressional delegation, and the news media of Ohio.51
