A R E S O L U T I O N

To reaffirm the Ohio Senate's support of the Patient
Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, As a direct result of the Patient Protection and
Affordable Care Act of 2010 (ACA), the number of non-elderly,
uninsured Americans has decreased by approximately 17 million
people, from over 44 million in 2010 to just below 27 million in
2016; and

WHEREAS, 2017 marked the first year since the ACA's passage
that the number of uninsured people increased rather than
decreased, with nearly 700,000 more uninsured people compared to
the previous year; and

WHEREAS, Estimates from the Centers for Disease Control and
Prevention (CDC) indicate that roughly 52 million adult
Americans have a preexisting condition that would have resulted
in them being denied coverage in the individual insurance
marketplace prior to the enactment of the ACA; and

WHEREAS, The CDC estimates that, prior to the ACA's
coverage expansions, approximately 18% of individual market
applications were denied; and

WHEREAS, Before the ACA, 91 million Americans were covered 20
by insurance plans that included lifetime benefit caps, 21
typically \$1 million, and that PricewaterhouseCoopers estimated 22
that there were approximately 20,000 to 25,000 Americans who had 23
exceeded these benefit caps and were ineligible for further 24
coverage; and 25

WHEREAS, The ACA allowed states to accept federal funding 26
to expand Medicaid and Ohio is one of 37 states to have done so, 27
allowing nearly 10 million Americans to gain coverage; and 28

WHEREAS, Prior to the Medicaid expansion, 32.4% of Ohioans 29
aged 19 to 64 with family income at or below 138% of the federal 30
poverty level were uninsured in 2012. This figure dropped to 31
14.1% in 2015, meaning that the Medicaid expansion lowered the 32
uninsured rate of this population by 18.3% in Ohio; and 33

WHEREAS, Almost one fifth of Ohioans aged 19 to 64, more 34
than 1.26 million people, have participated in the Ohio Medicaid 35
expansion since it began in 2015; and 36

WHEREAS, Many Medicaid expansion enrollees reported that 37
the Medicaid expansion made it easier for them to work because 38
they were able to obtain care for previously untreated health 39
conditions. In the words of one enrollee: "[Medicaid] allows me 40
to get surgery, which has allowed me to return to work."; and 41

WHEREAS, The most common reported reasons why Medicaid 42
expansion enrollees unenrolled from Medicaid were: 43

(1) Household income increased or the respondent got a job 44
(71.1%); 45

(2) The respondent obtained non-Medicaid health coverage 46
(48.8%); now therefore be it 47

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of 48
the State of Ohio hereby reaffirms its support of the Patient 49
Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010; and be it further 50
